#### **BEACONS OF LIGHT**

Last week, the Archdiocese of Cincinnati released the draft plan of Families of Parishes, the first phase of the *Beacons of Light* pastoral planning process. As I announced at all the Masses, St. Gertrude is a family of one parish. We have not been joined with another parish at this time. There is now an open comment

period wherein all the faithful of the archdiocese are invited to review the entire draft plan for the Families of Parishes and provide input regarding strengths, concerns, and ideas for improvement. Access to all information and maps of the draft Families of Parishes is found at www.beaconsaoc.org. I strongly encourage everyone to look at the website.

The draft Families of Parishes was created based on analysis of demographic data and data collected from all parishes and schools, along with consultation with priests and lay leaders from across the archdiocese. The current reality has been stated as follows:

#### **General Demographics**

- Since 2010, the percentage of Catholics vs. overall population in the archdiocese declined from 14.2% to 11.9%.
- Our 65 and older population is the fastest growing age group at 32.2% over the last 10 years and 14% over the next five years. Retiring Boomers' giving and liturgy attendance are significant sources of stability.
- Flat to declining birth rates for the last decade will impact the archdiocese and society for the next 25 years.

#### **Parishes**

- Mass attendance declined 22.5% over the last 10 years.
- Church facility utilization declined from 47.7% to 37.0%.
- Catholicity has declined in households (-5%), Sunday Mass attendance (-22.5%), and Sacraments (-19.4%) from 2010 to 2019.
- High number of churches located in areas of lower Catholicity, which is typical of older cities in the United States.

#### **Schools**

- Live birth and student populations have declined and are projected to be flat.
- Student enrollment has declined (-14%) in the past 10 years and is projected to continue (-5%) yet be moderate in the next five years.
- Largely, schools are not located close to areas of high potential.

#### Priests

- The archdiocese may not be able to support more than 60-65 pastor assignments to a parish region/family over the next 10 years; pastors of a single parish will be an anomaly.
- Currently, 26 (15.9%) pastors are eligible to retire, and 10 (6.1%) pastors are at mandatory retirement.

Our wonderful parish of St. Gertrude has not been immune from many of these current realities. Here is some general information:

- The number of active, registered households has decreased over 500 during the last 10 years.
- The number of people attending Sunday Masses has decreased so

- much that we are still able to accommodate everyone with one less Mass on Sundays.
- Enrollment in our parish school has declined to 306; we have a capacity for 400+.
- Since last October, we have been unable to resume perpetual eucharistic adoration in our adoration chapel because of a lack of volunteers to make a regular commitment to an hour of prayer.
- ❖ If you are watching the bulletin, we do not meet the budgeted amount for the offertory collection on many weekends.

Some parishioners have expressed to me a sigh of relief that we were not included in a family of multiple parishes. While I share the initial relief, this news does not exempt the parish from the *Beacons of Light* pastoral planning process like all other Families of Parishes in the archdiocese. The goal is to attain a new dynamism in every parish of the archdiocese where the mission of encountering Jesus, growing in faith, worshipping in community, and sharing the message with others is vibrant—like a beacon of light. As Archbishop Schnurr said in a meeting with the priests: "The status quo will not sustain us." Everyone is asked to pray for the archdiocese in this time of discernment and evaluation. Consider reviewing your own commitment and level of participation in the life of our parish. With the help of the Holy Spirit, we can be part of the renewal of our parish and the entire Archdiocese of Cincinnati.

On a more personal note, I will be out of sight for a couple of weeks. I am having minor surgery on my left foot (scheduled for this coming Wednesday) and need time for recovery. I will return as soon as I am able.

# MEET THE MINISTRY - L'ALTO: CONFIRMATION

Once in a while, we want to utilize this Evangelization page to highlight some great ministries in our parish. This month, we're taking a look at L'alto: Confirmation, our parish's new way of preparing young men and women to receive the sacrament of Confirmation.

#### What is L'alto: Confirmation?

L'alto: Confirmation is St. Gertrude Church's new model of formation for young men and women preparing to receive the sacrament of Confirmation in eighth grade. We have a two-year track that focuses on formation of the whole person so that young people will be as open as possible to receiving the grace of this sacrament.

#### Who is L'alto: Confirmation for?

L'alto: Confirmation is for any young person in seventh and eighth grade. Those who wish to be confirmed at St. Gertrude and who are not part of the formation program at St. Gertrude School need to be enrolled in this program—but we also welcome any young person in seventh and eighth grade to join us.

#### What does l'alto mean?

The word *l'alto* is Italian for *the heights*. It is based upon a famous phrase from Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati, a lay Dominican who lived in the early 20th century. Blessed Pier Giorgio lived a life of courageous faith, seeking to go to the heights of holiness and Christian maturity. In his own words, "The higher we go, the better we shall hear the voice of Christ." We have renamed all of our junior high and high school ministries with the word *l'alto* in the hope that we can invite our young people to live with that same goal: a life to the full (cf. John 10:10).

### What is the difference between L'alto: Confirmation and the previous Confirmation formation?

L'alto: Confirmation is based on the model of the Mass (which also happens to be the model for all great relationships). We begin by **gathering** our young people through engaging activities (like blowing up watermelons with rubber bands) that spark their desire for adventure and joy. We then transition into a **proclamation**, essential to the Gospel message for the coming weekend. We split off into small groups to **break open** the proclamation and apply it to daily life. Then, we spend some time in prayer. Finally, we end **sending** them out with an exhortation and concrete action step for each young person to take in the following weeks.

### Why did we change to this model of formation for Confirmation?

Our desire with this new model is to better mentor and disciple young people in the Christian life. The National Study of Youth and Religion, research from the Fuller Youth Institute, and numerous other anecdotal and sociological studies have found that after relationships with faithful and practicing parents, mentoring relationships with Christ-centered adults are the most prominent factor in developing a lifelong faith in the lives of young people. We hope that through fostering those relationships, as well as giving solid catechesis, we can foster lifelong disciples of Jesus Christ who live in communion with his Church.

#### Is this different from the L'alto: Junior High ministry?

Yes. In an effort to still have the great social events and fun junior high ministry of the past, we are hosting quarterly events under the name L'alto: Junior High. Any young person in grades seven and eight is welcome!





## BROTHER PATRICK STUCKER - EXCITING NEWS!



## THE LITURGY: PRAYING, BELIEVING, LIVING

Part six in an 8-part series.

#### The Songs We Sing: The Texts We Live

I think there would be universal agreement that music is one of the most tangible, if not the greatest, way through

which we experience beauty in the Mass. Music can draw people to a particular parish, and it can also drive people away from another parish. Painting with a very wide brush, since the beginning of the liturgical renewal, music has become one of the major issues of the so called "liturgy wars," and it is one of the top two areas of the liturgical renewal in which there has been much more failure than success.

#### What does the Church want?

The first decree of the Second Vatican Council was Sacrosanctum Concilium, the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy. Within this decree, the reader will find Musicam Sacram, the Instruction on the Proper Implementation of Music within the Sacred Liturgy. Musicam Sacram is filled with such great wisdom and directions that it is impossible to open its riches in this brief column. However, the following may serve as a facile synopsis:

- 1. The true purpose of sacred music is the glory of God and the sanctification of the faithful.
- The patrimony of the Church's music is to be carefully preserved, i.e. Gregorian Chant, the dialog responses between the priest and the faithful, and the primacy of the pipe organ above all other instruments.
- 3. The building up of the religious and joyful song of the ministers and faithful make the celebration more solemn and fulfilling.

#### How do we achieve what the Church desires?

If this is what the Church wants musically, how do we make this a reality in our celebrations? We fulfill this by the kind of music we sing. The Roman liturgy was never predicated upon the singing of hymnody; hymns were, and still are, particular to the Divine Office. The singing

of hymns during the celebration of the Mass, both before and especially after the Second Vatican Council, was to encourage the singing of the faithful *after* the proper parts (Entrance and Communion Antiphons, Responsorial Psalm, etc.) had been sung by the cantor or choirs.

So if not hymns, then what? First, the music of the Roman liturgy is built upon the singing of acclamations that are drawn from sacred Scripture, and particularly from the Psalms. (Think of the Entrance Antiphons [Introits] we are currently singing. They are all based on the Psalms.) In addition, the texts for the singing of the faithful can be drawn directly from the prayers found within the Roman Missal.

Secondly, the music of the Roman liturgy is built upon and flows from the singing of the dialogues between the priest and the faithful. For example, "The Lord be with you," "And with your spirit," etc. The music of the Roman Rite flows out of the texts of the Missal and leads us back into the text in one, seamless gesture.


#### What have we done?

I believe we are just beginning to truly implement what the Council Fathers asked of us to achieve the genuine renewal of the sacred liturgy and its music. At long last, we have begun to "sing the Mass" and not *sing at* the Mass. To sing the Mass draws us ever more deeply into the depths of the prayers of the Missal (technically referred to as the euchology). Consider today's Entrance Antiphon: *If you, O Lord laid bare our guilt, who could endure it?* That refrain is followed by the words of Psalm 129: *Out of the depths I call to you, O Lord....!* To sing the Mass draws us into a conversation with God, to which we respond with the words of God, and in which God has the final word.


