A STRING OF PARISH UPDATES

Over the last few months, there have been a *lot* of things happening at the parish; some very visible, others behind the scenes. In fact, far too many updates to be able to fit into one pastor letter. But over the next several weeks, I plan to share some of these updates with our parish community.

SCHOOL OPEN HOUSE

Last Sunday's St. Gertrude School Open House was a phenomenal success. I know that the Sisters, our faculty, and school families loved the opportunity to welcome everyone into the school and share a little bit about what makes our parish school so special. To all those who came over after the Masses, thank you for your presence, your enthusiasm, and your continued support of the "largest apostolate" of our parish.

GALA FUNDRAISER AND FORTHCOMING IMPROVEMENTS

I am happy to share that after accounting for all of our income and expenses from the Centennial Gala Fundraiser last November, we raised approximately \$90,000 in profits. In the months leading up to the Gala, I shared that any profits would be used for upgrades around our parish. After consulting with a number of parish bodies, including our pastoral council, the parish finance council, and the parish staff leadership team, the first target is going to be the restrooms in the Parish Center. We chose this as the primary target for several reasons. The Parish Center and gym are used extensively by both the school and our church ministries. Virtually every "big" event in our parish throughout the year happens in that building. And almost anything whether it is a special church event, an especially large school event, or athletic events through our sports boosters—that brings visitors to our parish property is held in that building; it's where we tend to welcome the most visitors to our campus. Those restrooms are certainly functional, but I don't think anyone would call them "nice," and they don't really give people a good "first impression" of our campus. While we certainly won't be putting in 24k gold faucet handles or using white Italian marble for the countertops, being able to refresh those two spaces and make them look more appealing than they currently are is something that will be welcomed, I am sure, by parishioners and visitors alike. We have already begun bringing in people to look at the spaces so that they can formulate initial proposals for the renovation. (Note: If anyone wishes to see a full accounting of the income and expenses from the gala, you can obtain that report from the business office.)

CHURCH SOUND SYSTEM

I know it seems like this sound system upgrade process has taken forever (because, quite frankly, it has) but I am able to share that we have moved on to the next phase! We have in hand three finalized, very detailed and technical bids; one each from companies in Connecticut, New York, and St. Louis that are all experts in the acoustics of such spaces as our church. I have assembled an ad hoc committee, composed of a mix of parish staff and lay people, to sit down with me to evaluate those bids. The committee members have been given the three bids and are individually reviewing them as we speak. After giving them some time to read through everything, my plan is to convene the committee in the next couple of weeks. If all goes well, my hope is that it would take only one or two committee meetings to land upon a decision about which proposal we consider the strongest. Once that decision is made, the proposal (because of the amount of money involved), will need to be approved by the parish finance and pastoral councils and then forwarded to the archdiocese for final approval. I will continue to keep everyone posted on the progress. Related to all this, I'll put out one final appeal: if there is anyone in the parish who has any experience in acoustics, sound engineering, or related fields who has not already been invited by me to be a part of this committee and is willing to assist me, please reach out to me in the next week. Thank you very much.

Many more updates to share, but those are a few big ones for now. Looking forward to what the coming spring and summer are going to bring to St. Gertrude Parish!



ASK A PRIEST— ANOINTING OF THE SICK

FATHER LUKE VANBERKUM

Q: I have several questions about the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. My first question is: Who can receive this sacrament?

A: That's a great question! Here is what the introduction to the rite says about who can receive this sacrament:

"Great care and concern should be taken to see that those of the faithful whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age receive this sacrament."

"The sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after being anointed and then falls ill or if during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious."

"A sick person may be anointed before surgery whenever a serious illness is the reason for the surgery."

"Elderly people may be anointed if they have become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present."

"Sick children are to be anointed if they have sufficient use of reason to be strengthened by this sacrament."

Q: What happens during Anointing of the Sick?

A: If time allows, this sacrament will be preceded by confession, a short reading, intercessions, a laying on of hands, and a prayer over the already blessed oil of the sick. The anointing, the prayer after anointing, the Our Father, and the final blessing follow. In an emergency situation, however, the sacrament can be reduced to the absolute essentials: the anointing with the oil of the sick and the sacramental words. Ideally, the anointing is done on the forehead and the palms of the hands but, if necessary, it can be done on any body part. Here are the essential words of the sacrament: "Through this holy anointing, may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit. May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up."

Q: What does this sacrament do? Will it heal me?

A: There is always the possibility that the anointing will physically

heal someone. God can heal someone if he desires, especially to strengthen the sick person's faith or the faith of someone else. But, whether or not a person is physically healed, there are so



many other wonderful effects of this sacrament that are often unseen. First, a person is joined to the suffering and healing Christ for an extended period of time. As Christ suffered for our salvation, the sick person's suffering, so joined to Christ, can become sanctifying, both for himself or herself and for those whom the sick person wishes to pray. The hospital bed becomes like an altar. Second, sins are forgiven, if the person has a habitual desire for reconciliation. Third, the grace of the Holy Spirit spiritually strengthens the person against any temptation to sadness or despair in the face of suffering.

Q: Where do you hear about Anointing of the Sick in Scripture?

A: We could look in the Gospels, for example Mark 6:13, but the text read in the sacrament itself is James 5:14–16: "Are there people sick among you? Let them send for the priests of the Church, and let the priests pray over them anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick persons, and the Lord will raise them up. If they have committed any sins, their sins will be forgiven them."

Q: Do you have to be conscious to receive this sacrament?

A: No! If someone is not conscious, the priest asks the person's spouse or family if the person would at least implicitly have wanted to receive the sacrament. If the person would have wanted to receive the sacrament, the priest can anoint the person even though he or she is unconscious.

Q: Is Anointing of the Sick the same as Last Rites?

A: No! Last Rites is an older term that refers to a whole series of sacraments and blessings that take place before death. For example, if possible, a person can go to confession, receive the Apostolic Pardon (a special blessing for the remission of some effects of sin), receive the Anointing of the Sick, and receive the Eucharist as Viaticum (food for the journey). All of this need not be timed precisely minutes before dying—please call us early! Anointing of the Sick is not only for the dying. It is a sacrament to strengthen all those whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age, as explained above.

Q: How do I schedule an anointing?

A: Whether it is an emergency or not, please call the parish office at (513) 561-5954. One of our amazing secretaries will help you. If the parish office is closed and it is an emergency, that same number will help you reach the priest who is on call.




