Dear St. Gertrude Parishioners,

After a long period of time, 37 years to be exact, I am once again assigned to St. Gertrude Priory. It's a joy to be back! To be sure, I was a novice way back then. I've returned as a "priest in residence." I'm not

sure what that means, but I'll let you know when I know.

A little about myself: My name is Father Vincent De Lucia, O.P. I was born and raised in New Haven, Connecticut. My university education in Connecticut was followed by several years in the business world. Ten years after graduation, I entered the novitiate. My priestly ordination on May 20, 1994, at St. Dominic Church in Washington, D.C., was presided by His Eminence Sean Cardinal O'Malley, OFM Cap.

Upon completion of my formative theological studies, I was assigned to Providence College in 1995, serving primarily as campus minister. During this period in Providence, I also served for a time as pastor of our parish, St. Pius V. After eight years in Rhode Island, I moved down the Interstate 95 corridor to New York City. There, I was part of the founding Dominican community at St. Joseph Church in Greenwich Village, serving as parochial vicar and later as director of the Catholic Center at New York University. In 2010, I was elected prior of our Dominican community at St. Mary Priory in my hometown of New Haven. It was great to be back and ministering in the place of my birth! In 2016, I left New England and moved to Youngstown. There I served as prior and pastor of St. Dominic Church and Priory for much of the past nine years.

Well, that's a cursory glance of the past 37 years! And now I've come full circle, to where it all began—St. Gertrude Priory. I look forward to the new opportunities that the Lord has in store for me as I continue this amazing journey toward him.





#### SISTER ANNE CATHERINE BURLEIGH, O.P., CELEBRATES HER SILVER JUBILEE

On Sunday, July 13, in Nashville, Sister Anne Catherine Burleigh, O.P., and nine other sisters

celebrated 25 years as Dominican Sisters of St. Cecilia. A native of Cincinnati and St. Gertrude Parish, Sister Anne Catherine is the daughter of Bill and Anne Burleigh and the sister of David Burleigh and Margaret Brecount.

Sister Anne Catherine made her first profession of vows on August 10, 2000. She has served in administrative and teaching roles at schools in Tennessee, Maryland, and Alabama, has served on the General Council for the Congregation since 2012, and has been the vicaress general of St. Cecilia Congregation since 2018. In addition to her role as vicaress general, she is currently the director of Mission Advancement for the Congregation.

In honor of this incredible milestone, St. Gertrude Bulletin asked Sister Anne Catherine's family to share how her vocation has impacted their lives.

St. Gertrude Bulletin: Looking back, can you recall any ways that you encouraged vocational discernment with your children? Anne Burleigh: If my husband and I had known years ago that one of our daughters would become a religious sister, we would have been grateful—and utterly astounded. Sister Anne Catherine would have been even more surprised. Although she anticipated being a teacher, her expectation was to marry and have children.

We were not what you would describe as a pious family. We prayed and attended Mass on Sundays, but our faith has taken a lifetime to emerge. We talked frequently about the Church and its relation to the world and met some fine priests, teachers, and friends who were pivotal in our and our children's formation, including Sister Anne Catherine.

**SGB** How has your relationship with your sister changed since she became a religious sister?

Margaret Brecount: Few things are as precious to me as my sister, who is my best friend. Offering her up was the hardest thing I've ever had to do. Over her decades of religious life, I've had to grieve at times and come to grips with the reality of our mutual sacrifice. Jesus has asked something hard of both of us,

but he promises fruitfulness with the sacrifice: "Unless a grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies, it remains but a single grain. But if it dies, it bears much fruit." Today our friendship is better than ever!

**SGB:** What has been the greatest blessing of your daughter/sister becoming a religious sister?

Anne: The blessings are countless, and none of them do we deserve. If I could encapsulate them, I would say that having a priestly or religious vocation in the family can prompt a deepening on all levels—a deeper immersion in asking who God is and what life is all about. It can lead family members to a greater love of Christ and an urgency to prioritize the essential things. For our family, the Dominican order, with its particular mission to proclaim the truth of Christ, is our anchor. Five of us are members of the Dominican laity. We simply cannot imagine our life apart from the Order of Preachers and our Dominican family of St. Cecilia sisters and Dominican friars and laity.

Margaret: I marvel at the work the Lord has done in my sister and could write a whole essay listing the incredible blessings that have flowed because of her vocation. Within six months of Sister Anne Catherine entering the convent, I met my husband, David. David and I are now lay Dominicans. As we've raised our five children, he and I have experienced profoundly palpable evidence of the Dominican sisters' prayers for our family. Sister Anne Catherine has introduced us to new friends and apostolates that have changed our lives. I meditate frequently on the sacred "presence of the habit" in my life, experienced most powerfully in Nashville at the motherhouse. What a precious gift her vocation has been to me!











#### STEWARDSHIP: RENEWAL OF TALENT

A stewardship renewal is an invitation to all parishioners to reflect on how you use the gifts

God has entrusted to you—your time, talent, and treasure. More than a call to volunteer or give, this renewal is a spiritual challenge to offer your resources back to God as an act of love and gratitude, to take a step in trust, and to grow as a faithful steward and joyful disciple!

#### What Does It Mean to Be Stewards of Our Talent?

God has given each one of us some kind of special gift, and it is our responsibility to use that gift for God's greater glory. It can look like cooking a meal for a friend in need, singing in the church choir, gifting handmade artwork you created, or using your talents in another way. God has a reason for giving you each of your gifts.

Being part of a ministry is another way God may be calling you to use your gifts. In our parish, we have a soup kitchen ministry that semi-regularly cooks meals and serves them to those in need. The Ladies of Charity and the Knights of Columbus run numerous fundraisers and activities that take planning and administrative skills, as well as directly serving and working with people in need. Every year at the Lenten Fish Fry, people cook, serve food, and bring together our parish community. Our Funeral Hospitality ministry consoles, coordinates, and bakes for those experiencing loss. There is a group that sews baptismal bibs for all the babies entering the Church. Our wonderful choirs use their gifts to provide beautiful and reverent music for our Masses. And that's just the tip of the iceberg of what our 50+ ministries do!

If you are interested in getting more involved and discovering where your gifts will have the most impact, please reach out to me, and we can work together to find where God is calling you to use your gifts!






