SOME LATE-SUMMER PARISH UPDATES

As the calendar turns from July to August, I want to share some of the highlights that this last month of summer will bring to our parish.

We're just about a week away from August 8, which is the solemnity of St. Dominic. That morning, in a private ceremony in the priory, our new group of novices will receive their Dominican habits and their religious names. Our normal 11:30 a.m. Mass that day will be the community's celebration of our patronal feast day, with the novices providing the music for the Mass.

A week later, on Friday, August 15 (the solemnity of the Assumption of Mary, a Holy Day of Obligation), the novices who have been with us this past year will be making their simple profession of vows at 11:30 a.m. Mass. We warmly invite anyone who is free to join us for this solemn and joy-filled occasion.

Then, the weekend of August 16-17 is going to be BIG, with a lot of things happening. First of all, this will be the first of several special stewardship renewals happening in the parish this year. The focus of this first one is on our stewardship of talent. We will be inviting everyone to reflect upon the talents, gifts, abilities, and experiences of your lives; to thank the Lord for those talents; and to discern whether there might be a way God is calling you to share those talents in serving him and your brothers and sisters. Our director of stewardship, Hope Ramundo, will be present after all Masses that weekend to assist in matching up your gifts and talents with the needs of the parish. (By the way, Hope just got married this summer . . . congratulations, Hope!) That Sunday will also be our annual parish ministries fair. Select ministries will have tables set up after Masses with information about their ministries.

And to top it all off, that will be the final weekend that Father Titus, our summer priest "help," is with us. Since he is newly ordained and there are special indulgences associated with getting a first priestly blessing from a newly ordained priest, he will be the celebrant for the 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday, August 17, and then bestow blessings in the Parish Center after Mass.

Finally, two announcements related to our music program. First, after many, many years of providing music for funerals at our

parish, our Resurrection Choir is drawing to a close. I am profoundly thankful for all those who sang in that choir throughout its existence. We will probably never know the full extent of the comfort that ministry brought to grieving families. On behalf of all of us at St. Gertrude Parish, THANK YOU to all of the past and current Resurrection Choir members.

The other announcement is that our director of music, Dr. Christopher Holman, has been appointed director of music and assistant professor of music at Mount St. Mary's Seminary in Cincinnati. No worries though, he will still continue in his role here at St. Gertrude Parish. Congratulations, Christopher, on your new appointment!

ROOTED

"Looks like it never took root."

My wife and I have come to this unhappy realization several times in

our attempt to have a home garden. Whether it be tomatoes, cucumbers, carrots, or cilantro, the foundational key to planting vegetables and herbs is establishing healthy roots in good soil. There are many other reasons why a plant might fail to thrive (such as deer!), but it all begins with being rooted. Outside of gardening, we often hear this word used in everyday conversation. For example, when someone gets married or buys a house, we often say they are "putting down roots." Likewise, when searching for a solution to a complex problem or situation, we often hear people say they want to get to the "root" cause of the problem.

The Merriam-Webster dictionary provides several definitions for the word "rooted," including this one, which I think broadly covers many of the different uses of the word: "something that is an origin or source (as of a condition or quality)." In the context of our journey of discipleship with Jesus, we can think of our need to be firmly rooted in him, who is the "source and summit" of the Christian life (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1324). Our relationship with Jesus is foundational: he is the one who leads us to the Father in the Holy Spirit.

The need to be rooted in Christ Jesus is also true within the context of family life. Through the sacrament of Matrimony, the bond between husband and wife is elevated by the grace of Christ. The Catechism beautifully echoes this truth, saying, "Christ dwells with (the couple), gives them the strength to take up their crosses and so follow him, to rise again after they have fallen, to forgive one another, to bear one another's burdens, to 'be subject to one another out of reverence for Christ,' and to love one another with supernatural, tender, and fruitful love" (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1642). Christ, then, is at the heart of the marital bond, supplying all the grace needed for the couple to grow in love with him and each other. This grace redounds to the offspring of the married couple, who are called to be the "first heralds" of the Gospel for them (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1656). It is within the context of the family, the domestic Church, that the evangelization of children begins, is sustained,

and is brought to maturation. Finally, married couples do not walk this journey alone; the parish is called to be a family of families, a place of authentic Christ-centered community accompanying each other on our pilgrimage through this life.

Summing this all up, we can say that couples are called to be rooted in Christ for each other, for their families, within the parish community. Beginning this September, we are launching a new program called Rooted: Family Baptism Formation, which seeks to help couples grow in this rootedness as they prepare to have their young children baptized. Rooted will happen once a month, typically on the first Sunday, and include:

- lunch,
- catechesis on Baptism and the role of parents and godparents in building the domestic Church,
- witness talks from married couples, and
- workshopping practical suggestions and ideas.

While designed primarily for parents desiring Baptism for their first children (whether their first overall children or their first children being baptized at St. Gertrude Parish) or those who haven't had a child baptized in five years, this program is also open to any couple desiring Baptism for a child who is seeking more formation and community. It is our hope that providing a deeper understanding of the grace of the sacraments of Matrimony and Baptism, along with a greater sense of community and connection, will help couples cultivate authentic Christian homes, becoming a sign of God's love, which will transform the world.




