# THE WISDOM OF ONE OF THE GREAT SAINTS

Earlier this week, we celebrated the feast day of St. Augustine, bishop and Doctor of the Church. All Catholics owe a great debt to St. Augustine, as he is one of the

greatest teachers and theologians in the Church and one of the four "fathers of the Western Church." He also holds a special place in the lives of Dominicans, as St. Dominic chose the Rule of St. Augustine as the foundational rule for our religious life. This year, our attention is specially drawn to this saint because Pope Leo XIV is an Augustinian priest and religious. Rather than writing a full letter this week simply telling you about this great saint, I thought it would be better to let St. Augustine himself do the talking. So, without further ado, let me share some of my favorite passages from the writings of this amazing saint.

"You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you."

"Late have I loved you, O Beauty ever ancient and ever new! Late have I loved you! And, behold, you were within me, and I out of myself, and there I searched for you."

"Bad times, hard times, this is what people keep saying; but let us live well, and the times shall be good. We are the times: Such as we are, such are the times."

"I have read in Plato and Cicero sayings that are very wise and very beautiful; but I never read in either of them, 'Come unto me, all ye that labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest...'"

"For God loves saving, not condemning, and therefore He is patient with bad people, in order to make good people out of bad people."

"What is love's perfection? To love our enemies, and to love them to the end that they may become our brothers."


"To fall in love with God is the greatest romance; to seek Him the greatest adventure; to find Him, the greatest human achievement."

#### SPECIAL COLLECTION FOR THOSE IN GAZA

With great concern for the ongoing crisis in Gaza, the USCCB has requested that dioceses throughout the country organize a voluntary special collection to provide humanitarian relief and pastoral support to those suffering in Gaza and the surrounding areas of the Middle East. # 2025-2026 SACRED MUSIC SERIES KICKS OFF IN LESS THAN TWO WEEKS!

Dr. Christopher Holman Director of Music

One of the great joys of serving at St. Gertrude is welcoming people of all ages and backgrounds into

the beauty of the Church's musical tradition. Our second Sacred Music Series begins in just a few weeks, giving us the chance to gather as a parish family to experience works of faith that have inspired Christians for centuries. I warmly invite each of you to the opening program on **Friday**, **September 12**, at **7 p.m.**, featuring a work especially dear to me: Johann Sebastian Bach's *Mass in G Major*, sung by the Capella with an orchestra of virtuoso specialists playing instruments from Bach's time.

Bach composed this masterpiece around 1738—not as a concert piece, but as sacred music for the liturgy. In it, extended settings of the Kyrie and Gloria come alive with soaring lines, joyful rhythms, and the profound reverence that marks all of his sacred music. Remarkably, it is one of his only choral-orchestral works written (most likely) for the Roman Catholic liturgy, weaving together prayer and praise in music that is at once humble and exalted.

I am especially delighted to welcome back as lead first violin, **Zachary Carrettin**, whose artistry so moved us last season. Alongside Zachary, we have invited extraordinary historical instrument players from across the United States—from New York City, Seattle, Charlotte, Pittsburgh, and beyond. Many of them are musicians I first worked with as an undergraduate. It's not an exaggeration to say I learned how to play baroque music from working with these artists, and it is a special joy to bring them together again under one roof—most especially, here at my spiritual home.

And this is only the beginning. The rest of the Sacred Music Series will carry us through a wide range of sacred masterpieces, including the captivating melodies of French grand opera adapted to the Church, the elegance of Haydn and Mozart, the poignant contrasts of two settings of the *Stabat Mater*, and a harpsichord recital that will challenge every preconceived notion of the instrument. Each program is an opportunity not only to hear beautiful music but also to pray, reflect, and lift our hearts to God.

I warmly encourage you to consider a season subscription. Subscribing not only saves you 25 percent compared to individual tickets, but also ensures you won't miss any part of this journey. More importantly, your subscription helps make it

possible to continue offering concerts of this caliber here at St. Gertrude—a true gift of beauty for our parish and the wider community. We are also offering family tickets: For just \$60, your entire household can attend together—less than the cost of a single ticket to most concerts at Music Hall.

Please mark your calendars, invite a friend, and join us as we begin this year's Sacred Music Series with Bach's joyful *Mass in G*. Together, let us give thanks for the gift of sacred music and, through it, give glory. As Bach so often wrote, *Soli Deo gloria*—to God alone be the glory.

# THE TRANSFORMATIVE POWER OF DOMINICAN EDUCATION

Sister Mariana Thayer, O.P. Vice Principal of SGS

This year, St. Gertrude School welcomes Sister Mariana Thayer, O.P., as vice principal.

She brings a thoughtful perspective on education and faith and a steadfast dedication to forming students in intellect, character, and virtue. In the conversation below, she shares her vision for the school and what most excites her about serving at St. Gertrude.

Q: As a Dominican sister, you bring the 800-year-old tradition of St. Dominic into our school. How do you see that heritage shaping the daily life of our students?

A: Dominican life rests on four pillars, each shaping the hearts and minds of our students. Prayer – The Eucharist is the heart of both Dominican life and St. Gertrude School, and our centrally located chapel invites students to pause, reflect, and encounter Christ throughout their days. Study – By our very nature, we seek truth, and our teachers inspire a love of learning that reaches beyond the classroom. Community – Students discover the value of true friendship and grow in virtue together, especially within the school's vibrant household system. Service – Created in God's image, our students are taught to honor and serve their classmates, teachers, families, and the broader community with reverence and generosity.

Q: St. Gertrude is one of only two schools in the country blessed with the daily presence and partnership of Dominican sisters and friars. What difference does that make for our students and families?

A: Two distinctions stand out. First, through the presence of the sisters and friars, students and families witness the profound joy that flows from trusting in God's providence, a joy that is both beautiful and transformative. Second, the friars and sisters are united in heart and mind in God, creating a space in which the Holy Spirit can abundantly pour out grace upon our school and community.

Q: Many schools promise strong academics and good values. What is it about a Dominican education at St. Gertrude that forms the whole child in a uniquely Catholic way?

A: Strong intellectual formation is essential, but a Dominican education extends beyond the mind. It shapes the will, the emotions, the senses, and the body, all within the light of a Catholic worldview. Our aim is to cultivate in students a love of truth in every aspect of life, a pursuit that ultimately draws them into a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ, the source of all truth.

Q: What most excites you about stepping into the role of vice principal here, and what would you say to a parish family that hasn't yet considered St. Gertrude School for its children?

A: From my first visit to St. Gertrude last May, it was clear that faculty, staff, and parents are dedicated to helping students become who God has created them to be. They understand that the most important question is not, "What will you be when you grow up?" but, "Who will you be?" I am thrilled to join this community. For any parish family considering St. Gertrude School, I warmly invite you to reach out. I would be delighted to meet you and answer your questions.






