### **GO TO JOSEPH!**

Several years ago, when I was still living in Connecticut, it came time for my annual retreat. I decided that, rather than "hole up" in the guest room of a monastery or retreat house somewhere—which

is what I usually do for my annual retreat—I decided to make a pilgrimage to the Oratory of St. Joseph, which is in Montreal, Canada. It is the largest church in honor of St. Joseph anywhere in the world. It is a truly massive structure composed of six levels in total—from the great upper church on top, to a crypt church at the bottom—on top of a hill. I had never been to the Oratory and yet had heard so much about it. Being a relatively close drive, I felt the Lord was calling me to make a "pilgrimage-retreat" at the Oratory.

There were many wonderful experiences and graces I experienced on the retreat, far too many to recount here, but perhaps the most significant for me was a deepening of my understanding and appreciation of how important St. Joseph is in our lives as Catholics. There is a beautiful area of the lowest level of the shrine where there are a series of bas-relief images of St. Joseph under his various titles: St. Joseph, Protector of the Church . . . Consoler of the Afflicted . . . Hope of the Sick . . . Terror of Demons . . . Guardian of Families. Seeing these images and reading the various titles reminded me that we have so many reasons to turn to St. Joseph to ask his assistance, his prayers, his intercession. Those currently raising families should pray to St. Joseph, that he might help guard and guide your families in both your spiritual and temporal needs. Those struggling with temptations to various sins can invoke the powerful intercession of St. Joseph as Terror of Demons. Those suffering from illness or other afflictions can invoke his powerful intercession for healing and strength. And all of us can invoke his protection as the universal patron and Protector of the Universal Church—and invoke his protection over our own parish as well. There is an old Latin phrase that comes to mind here: Ite ad Ioseph. It means, simply, "go to Joseph." Go to him in whatever need you may have.

To conclude, I would like to share the prayer that sits at the base of the main statue of St. Joseph in this area of the crypt. It is a prayer to him that can be prayed for his help and intercession with any need.


O Blessed Saint Joseph, tender-hearted father, faithful guardian of Jesus, chaste spouse of the Mother of God, I pray that you may remind God our Father of all the love that He had for us by offering us His Son, who, through His death and resurrection brought us new life. By the power of Jesus pray with us so that we may obtain

from our eternal Father the favor that we are requesting [mention request]. Because we have been unfaithful, beg our loving God for mercy. Look down upon us with compassion. Remember all those who toil, who suffer, and who grieve. May the Lord Jesus, sensitive to our prayers and attentive to your intercession and that of your most holy Spouse, the Virgin Mary, grant us the grace to live always in joy and hope. Amen.

### SOURDOUGH AND THE DOMESTIC CHURCH

Walter Plummer, Director of Children & Youth Evangelization

From the fullness of the heart, the mouth speaks. My glutenous heart is chock-full of sourdough bread and daily life with five young

children. As the fall comes around, I want to share with you a few reflections on both of those subjects. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says that "believing families are of primary importance as centers of living, radiant faith" (CCC 1656), and "the home is the first school of Christian life. . . . Here one learns endurance and the joy of work, fraternal love, generous even repeated-forgiveness, and above all divine worship in prayer and the offering of one's life" (CCC 1657). And lest we forget that all are invited into the family of God, whether they are married and have their own children or not, "No one is without a family in this world: the Church is a home and family for everyone, especially those who 'labor and are heavy laden'" (CCC 1658). That, to me, sounds like a delicious loaf of theological sourdough, piping hot from the magisterial oven. But, while I love the finished product, I'm a bit unsure how we get there, both for sourdough and for my family. How do we start? What ingredients do we use? How long will it take? While I can't claim to answer any of those definitively—about sourdough or family life—perhaps the following paragraphs can serve as a witness and a reminder to those of us who still wonder when we'll see the finished product.

#### It's a Gift

Our sourdough experience really began when my sister-in-law gave us her starter and a brand new Dutch oven in which to bake it. We were completely surprised by the Dutch oven, but, looking back, it makes perfect sense. My wonderful sister-in-law loves sourdough and loves us, and couldn't wait to go above and beyond to offer us everything she could. Maybe our families are like that, too. We start with the gift of life, the gift of our experiences, the gift of love that, while we were sinners, led the Son of God to become one of us, die and rise for us, and pour out his own Spirit to live in us. We're given the gift of those people who, because of their love of God and of us, offered us a few measures of spiritual yeast and a place for it to grow. It's a gift. All of it. You've never had to do it by yourself, and still don't today.

#### Simple, Not Easy

Every time we eat a fresh loaf of sourdough, I tell my wife how good it tastes. This is not only good PR, it's true. And every time, she says, "Flour, salt, and water. That's all it is." And yet, despite its simplicity, the recipe isn't easy. You have to feed the

starter, form the dough, wash dishes, and more. All by hand. Again, maybe this is like our families. Simple ingredients: love, generosity, discipline, forgiveness, work. A measure of divine yeast: sacraments, prayer, sacred Scripture, the people of God. From those simple realities, beautiful results can grow. And yet how hard can it sometimes be to get to Mass or confession, set aside time for prayer amid all of our worries, ask for help, find someone willing to help, love, be generous, forgive? If it feels like you're swimming upstream with (or in) your family, just remember: God calls for simplicity, not ease. Remember too: the results are worth it.

### Time Is Part of the Recipe

It takes my wife two days to make sourdough. There are a number of steps of which I'm only dimly aware, but my wife has calculated precisely to optimize deliciousness. I heard a mental health professional once say the "finished product" of childhood happens sometime around 24 or 25 years old. Some might argue it takes even longer. The seasons of our lives, providentially ordered, are meant to optimize our opportunities to truly become those centers of living, radiant faith. (*Nota bene*: Not always health, wealth, and a fridge in every kitchen. Something even better. See Exodus and Matthew 28 for more details.) So be at peace. The yeast is still rising.

Perhaps this fall, as you live out whatever the rhythms might be for your family (and hopefully eat some delicious sourdough bread), these simple things can help us live well in our little schools of Christian life. And if that's the case, I want to ask you one more thing: Ask someone else how his or her family is doing, and share the lessons you've been learning—and maybe bring them some bread while you're at it.




