FAITH, SCIENCE, AND ST. ALBERT THE GREAT

The same weekend as the feast of St. Gertrude, we also celebrate another saint: St. Albert the Great. He was a Dominican friar, an extraordinary scholar, and

eventually a bishop. He is most known for two things:

- 1. When a very young St. Thomas Aquinas joined the Order of Preachers, it was very apparent that he was incredibly smart and wouldn't really benefit from "normal" classes. Instead, St. Albert the Great was assigned to be his personal mentor. Much of how Aquinas approached thinking about philosophy and theology came from St. Albert.
- 2. He is the patron saint of scientists. This is because he was generally regarded as the greatest scientist of his era, writing encyclopedic volumes on astronomy, chemistry, biology, anatomy, and basically every other field of scientific study that existed in the 1200s.

It is this second thing that I'd like to focus on today. The photo on this page is a stained glass window of St. Albert the Great from the St. Gertrude Priory chapel. Under St. Albert's feet is Saturn, chemistry beakers and test tubes, and the like. (I think this is the only stained glass window I've ever seen in my life that has chemistry beakers. Being a chemistry major as an undergrad, I completely love it!)

Today, some people assert that faith and modern science are incompatible. This is the farthest thing from the truth. Indeed, the Catholic Church has a long history of scientists. Nicholas Copernicus, who discovered the Earth revolved around the sun (rather than vice versa) a century before Galileo was born, was a devout Catholic and almost certainly a member of the Dominican Third Order (what we now call the Dominican Laity). Gregory Mendel, the inventor of the science of genetics, was an Augustinian monk. Louis Pasteur, who developed the germ theory of disease, was a devout Catholic who prayed the rosary daily. In the world of astronomy, Georges Lemaître, Catholic priest from Belgium, developed the big bang theory. In more recent times, Sister Mary Kenneth Keller, a Catholic religious sister, was the first woman in the entire United States to earn a PhD in computer science. And Jérôme Lejeune (d. 1994), a close personal friend of Pope St. John Paul II, discovered that an extra chromosome caused Down syndrome. It is generally agreed that his discovery would have certainly earned him the Nobel prize, except that he was a vocal pro-life advocate on behalf of the unborn and especially against the selective abortions of children diagnosed with Down syndrome.

While many in our society might be shocked at that litany

(which is only a fraction of the Catholics who have made significant contributions in the sciences), we Catholics should not be. After all, as we profess in the first lines of the Creed every Sunday, "I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible." As the creator of everything, all of creation bears the imprint of its creator. And thus, the study of anything in the visible world, when done correctly and with a searching and open mind, eventually leads back to God. As Werner Heisenberg, one of the towering figures of modern quantum physics, once wrote, "The first gulp from the glass of natural sciences will turn you into an atheist, but at the bottom of the glass God is waiting for you."

As we celebrate St. Albert the Great on November 15, let's be rightly proud of the long and storied history of our Catholic scientists and never doubt that faith and science are not enemies, but fast friends.

UNITED IN HOPE: AN EVENING OF PRAYER, SONG & CONVERSATION ACROSS TRADITIONS Christopher Holman Director of Music

This past week, the world

witnessed a first in Christian history: Pope Leo XIV hosted a joint prayer service in the Sistine Chapel with King Charles III of the United Kingdom. This was more than a routine diplomatic exercise; it was the first time that a reigning British monarch (who is also the head of the worldwide Anglican Communion) had publicly prayed with a pope. It was a moment that recognized that the wounds of division between Catholics and Anglicans, with origins reaching back nearly four centuries, can begin to heal through shared prayer and renewed friendship.

In that same spirit, I invite you to **United in Hope**, a special event at St. Gertrude Parish on Tuesday, November 11. At 7 p.m., our Schola Cantorum will join forces with the renowned Choir School of St. Thomas Episcopal Church (Terrace Park) to present the service of choral Evensong. This profoundly beautiful liturgy, composed of psalms, Scripture readings, and the canticles *Magnificat* and *Nunc dimittis*, is the only form of Christian public worship with text identical in both the Anglican Communion and the Roman Catholic Church (through the Ordinariate Use).

Preceding the service will be a panel discussion between clergy from local Christian churches, including our own Father John Paul Walker, O.P., Reverend Darren Elin from St. Thomas Episcopal, and more. The discussion will be moderated by St. Gertrude Parish parishioner Nathan Smith, who serves as the director of Ecumenism for Glenmary Home Missioners. This conversation will explore how Christians can foster genuine dialogue and shared witness in today's polarized world.

The Dominican Order has always viewed the unity of the Church as its central reason for being. Blessed Humbert of Romans, the sixth master of the Order (and compiler of the Dominican Rite), noted that "Nothing so much contributes to the ruin of religion as discord; nothing so much builds it up as unity." His words, penned in the 13th century, capture the heart of the Dominican mission. At St. Gertrude Parish, we continue this work through our life of prayer, study, and the apostolate of sacred music. Collaborating with our Anglican/Episcopalian and Protestant neighbors is not an exercise in polite diplomacy, but a living expression of the Gospel imperative "that they may all be one" (John 17:21). The voices of our two choirs, joined in psalms and hymns, give audible form to that unity: one faith, one hope, and one longing for peace. And the panel discussion

will provide an important opportunity for rich, meaningful dialogue in our highly polarized world.

It is fitting that this event takes place on the feast of St. Martin of Tours, the soldier-turned-monk whose act of compassion—dividing his cloak to clothe a beggar—became a symbol of Christian charity. Honored in both the Catholic and Anglican calendars, St. Martin reminds us that true unity begins in mercy: the love that recognizes Christ in every person and craves "that peace which the world cannot give" (Collect for Peace, Liturgy of Evensong). The Holy Father recently reminded us that "peace begins with each one of us: in the way we look at others, listen to others, and speak about others" (Leo XIV, Address to the Media, May 12, 2025). As the universal Church prays for renewed communion among Christians, we will do our small part here in Madeira—and I hope you will join us.



GUIDING SECOND GRADERS TO CHRIST

Sister Rosaria Bermejo, O.P. Second Grade Teacher

At St. Gertrude School, faith and formation go hand in hand. Nowhere is that more evident

than in our second grade classroom, where students prepare to encounter Jesus in the sacraments for the first time. This month, we had the joy of sitting down with Sister Rosaria, O.P., one of our Dominican Sisters of St. Cecilia and second grade teacher, whose deep love for Christ and her students animates every moment of the school day.

Q: Can you share a bit about your vocational journey and educational background prior to teaching at SGS?

I heard God's call to be set apart for him alone when I was 14 years old. On the feast of St. Agnes, the Church proclaims her words in the Divine Office: "What I longed for, I now see; what I hoped for, I now possess; in heaven I am espoused to him whom on earth I loved with all my heart." These words pierced my heart, and I knew God was inviting me to love him like St. Agnes. Later that year, I met the Dominican Sisters of St. Cecilia in my home Archdiocese of Vancouver, Canada. Experiencing their joyful witness as brides of Christ gave direction to the call I received. After a year of college, I entered our community in 2016. In 2018, I made my first religious profession, and in 2023, my perpetual profession.

Prior to teaching at SGS, I earned a bachelor of science in interdisciplinary studies from Aquinas College, TN, where I also completed a year of student teaching in kindergarten and first grade. For the past three years, I have taught second grade at St. Croix Catholic School in Stillwater, MN, serving as a Level II catechist and assistant in The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. I am currently a candidate for a master of arts in theology with a concentration in Thomas Aquinas from Providence College, RI.

Q: Second grade is such a pivotal year for students preparing for First Reconciliation and First Communion. How do you help your students grow spiritually during this important time?

It is a gift and an honor to walk with second graders as they prepare for First Reconciliation and First Communion. Every year when the children receive these sacraments, I take a step back and marvel at how the children are so well prepared. This is really God's hidden work; he prepares the heart of each child to receive his gifts with love, peace, and joy. Parents and other adults are invited to take part in this preparation, which is not just confined to religion class or the atrium but is meant to permeate their entire lives. For my part, I invite the children to keep their hearts and minds open to grace by preparing for and actively participating in weekly school Mass, making daily visits to the school chapel, working and praying well during weekly atrium sessions, and making Jesus the center of our classroom.

Q: We've heard that you incorporate special rhythms of prayer into your classroom. Can you share a little about what that looks like and how it helps your students?

I believe Jesus Christ is the true teacher in our classroom, and my role is to work with him to help the children grow in holiness, freedom, and charity. Since only the Holy Spirit can transform hearts, I invite my students to respond to his grace and live as children of God. Each hour, we pause to kneel and pray a verse from Scripture, reminding ourselves that Jesus is with us and calling us to remain in him (John 15). Over time, I've seen the children come to love these verses, which remind them not only who they are, but also whose they are.

Q: How do you balance strong academic instruction with faith formation in your classroom, especially in such a foundational year?

Faith formation is the foundation from which I help children grow academically. As The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd presents, God invites each of us to write our own pages in the history of his kingdom. How do we write this page well? Each day, I remind the children that it's about not just what you do, but how and why you do it, and that we do it for the love of God! This love for God powerfully motivates them to grow in knowledge and skill. Growing in virtue enables them to receive rigorous academic formation. When they struggle—academically, emotionally, or socially—they learn to depend on God for the grace to grow. God wants to help us think, pray, and act because he has made us for greatness. He has made us for heaven.


