IT'S NOT THE BOAT THAT KEEPS US ABOVE WATER

Then he made the disciples get into the boat and precede him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. After doing so, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray.

When it was evening he was there alone. Meanwhile the boat, already a few miles offshore, was being tossed about by the waves, for the wind was against it. During the fourth watch of the night, he came toward them, walking on the sea. When the disciples saw him walking on the sea they were terrified. "It is a ghost," they said, and they cried out in fear. At once [Jesus] spoke to them, "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid." Peter said to him in reply, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." He said, "Come." Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward Jesus. But when he saw how strong the wind was he became frightened; and, beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!" Immediately Jesus stretched out his hand and caught him, and said to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" After they got into the boat, the wind died down. Those who were in the boat did him homage, saying, "Truly, you are the Son of God" (Matthew 14:22-33).

I have to admit, I sometimes have a hard time connecting with some of the events of Jesus' life and the parables that he used because, at least at the literal level, they are so far away from my own experience. I've never raised sheep nor had to go off after a lost one. I've never been a wealthy landowner with a vineyard. I've never seen a full-grown mustard plant or drawn water from a Samaritan well or been a merchant in search of fine pearls. Nor have I built a tower in my olive field, witnessed a legion of demons enter a herd of swine, eaten dinner at a tax collector's house, or been asked to feed a crowd of 5,000 with a few loaves and fish.

But I have been in a boat out on the water when the weather started turning, the sky was going dark, and the winds were starting to pick up. It was definitely a very scary experience. Thankfully, we made it back to shore before the storm really hit, but I can at least imagine the sheer terror of being in a small boat being tossed about by large waves and lashed by whipping winds. I can also imagine in that situation clinging to that boat for dear life, realizing it was the only thing keeping me from ending up in the maelstrom of the stormy sea.

Except . . . it's *not* the only thing keeping me from the stormy sea. Nor is it even the most effective thing keeping me from the stormy sea. When Jesus calls to Peter, Peter steps out of the storm-tossed boat and walks on the water. Often we focus (too much) on the fact that, after a while, Peter became afraid and

began to sink. Don't forget—at least for a little while, **Peter was actually walking on the water!!!**

So often in the stormy periods of our own lives, we find ourselves clinging more and more to our "boat" (whatever our boat may be). We may even find ourselves capsizing and struggling with all of our might to repair the leaks in the boat. This Gospel passage reminds us that true stability, true safety from the storms of life, is never to be found in any boat, but only in Christ. Indeed, like Peter, sometimes what we most need to do is forget the boat entirely, fix our gaze directly on Jesus, and follow his voice as he calls us out of the boat entirely. As long as our gaze is fixed on him, then there are no waves, no winds, no storms that have the power to drag us under.

When facing the storms of life, our typical first reaction is to ask Jesus to calm the wind and the seas. And indeed, sometimes he does exactly that. But other times, he refuses to calm the storms—because he knows what we most need is to trust that he will give us the power to step out and walk on the water.

May our gaze be always fixed on Christ and Christ alone.

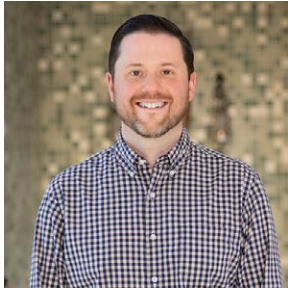

EVANGELIZATION & FAITH FORMATION HIGHLIGHTS

Tyler Castrucci

Director of Evangelization

Two weeks ago, we released our parish's FY 2024-2025 Annual Report, which detailed the financial

and spiritual health of our parish. Included in that report was a quick snapshot of a few significant things that happened in the realm of evangelization and faith formation. But what exactly is the Office of Evangelization & Faith Formation? What do we do? Who are we? **To put it very simply, our office exists to make disciples and equip others to do this important work.**

At St. Gertrude Parish, we are incredibly blessed to have a team of evangelists to direct, coordinate, and shepherd the ministry of evangelization and catechesis across all age levels. Here are some highlights from this past fiscal year.

ADULT EVANGELIZATION & FAITH FORMATION

Pathway of Discipleship

Evangelizing adults is a key parish priority. Led by the Holy Spirit, we continually work to revitalize and renew our efforts to bring more people into the Church and nourish those who are already here. **To that end, we have developed a pathway of discipleship as a clear and simple way for adults to know, love, and serve the Lord.** The pathway has four stages: **Start**, **Encounter**, **Nourish**, and **Transform**. Together, these stages form the acronym **SENT**, which speaks to the fundamental missionary nature of Christian discipleship. **Start** offerings, such as Bourbon & Books, focus on community and building relationships. **Encounter** initiatives, such as Alpha, are designed to introduce someone to the basic message of the Gospel. **Nourish** offerings, such as Omega, seek to help Catholics grow—intellectually and spiritually—in intimacy with Jesus. **Transform** offerings, such as Called and Gifted, are designed to help adults recognize their gifts and be commissioned to use them to evangelize and build up the Church.

There is still much work to be done to continue to develop and refine this pathway and call forth more leaders to help with these efforts. It is my dream that St. Gertrude Parish will have a spiritual army of parishioners ready, willing, and able to joyfully embrace their baptismal call to be a missionary and a disciple and to participate in the ministry of evangelization. In particular, we hope to significantly grow in our outreach efforts to non-Catholics and equip more parishioners to form apostolates and develop skills to evangelize more effectively. Both our Hospitality Team and Evangelization Team are important components in this effort, and we hope to continue to grow

them both and increase their impact.

New Family Baptism Formation

Also in the adult evangelization realm, **we recently implemented a new group-style Baptism formation called Rooted: Family Baptism Formation.** This new initiative seeks to build community among parents who are seeking to have their first child baptized at St. Gertrude Parish and offers them encouragement and practical advice for fulfilling their role as the primary formators of their children.

CHILDREN AND YOUTH EVANGELIZATION & FAITH FORMATION

Confirmation Preparation

Our director of children and youth evangelization, Walter Plummer, introduced a **new overnight retreat experience for 7th and 8th graders preparing to receive the sacrament of Confirmation.** Additionally, we introduced a **new small group-based method of Confirmation preparation that is inspired by Montessori principles.** We have already seen great fruit from this and are excited to see the Holy Spirit at work.

Family Faith

Our Family Faith program, which is a whole family catechesis experience for parents with children in grades 4-6, has been refreshed using *The Bible Timeline: The Story of Salvation* curriculum for children by Ascension Press. Families look at the story of salvation history and have special time to talk together about faith in Jesus Christ.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS)

Our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program coordinator, Mary Beth Thiemann, together with Lauren Mays, our CGS assistant, and a team of volunteers, worked diligently to create a new atrium in the Parish Center. In addition to Level 1 and Level 2 classes, we now offer two Level 3 classes for older children (grades 4-6). **CGS has been a great blessing to our parish and something for which we are in need of more catechists to help sustain into the future. If you feel called to this ministry, I encourage you to be on the lookout for information about the upcoming CGS Seed Planting Workshop on November 15.** This is a great opportunity to learn more about CGS and what it means to be a catechist for the program.

Youth Ministry

Shannon Loughrey, our coordinator of youth ministry, **restarted our junior high youth ministry program with three successful summer events.** We are excited to see this program return to St. Gertrude Parish and look forward to how it will grow and evolve in the months and years to come. Additionally, Shannon has been collaborating with St. Gertrude School to help build

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community among 8th-grade students as they prepare to enter high school and has invited them into L'alto: High School Youth Ministry.

BECOME CATHOLIC

Of course, **one of the cornerstones of what we do in the Office of Evangelization and Faith Formation is work with individuals who are seeking to become Catholic.** We have seen a significant increase in the number of individuals (both adults and children) reaching out to become Catholic. This growth is a great blessing and a grace of the Holy Spirit—and also presents real challenges in terms of our resources. Over the coming year, we will be thinking of new and creative ways to continue to meet inquirers where they are and accompany them through the process of becoming Catholic.

COMMUNICATIONS

Our director of communication, Michelle Dushensky, worked tirelessly with a small team of staff to **redesign our parish website and refresh our branding to make it more welcoming, engaging, and evangelizing.** Also in the past year, we redesigned the layout of our bulletin with the aim of making it more engaging and welcoming, particularly for new parishioners or visitors to St. Gertrude Parish.

PARISH DATABASE

Behind the scenes, our office coordinator, Kristen Eggers, continues to be the glue that holds all of the pieces of the puzzle together. She has worked incredibly hard to help us better leverage our new parish database system, which enables us to improve registration processes for programs and events, keep more accurate records, and also integrate more fully with our new website.

As you can see, our Office of Evangelization & Faith Formation team is doing incredible work for our parish. **Nevertheless, we know we have much to do to improve our adult evangelization efforts and refine how we assist parents in forming their children.** We no longer live in the age of Christendom, when Christian values drove the wider culture. This new “missionary moment,” as Archbishop Casey calls it, requires greater creativity and trust in the Lord Jesus. Systems and structures that might have worked in the past are no longer relevant. **To this end, our office is working very intentionally to strategize about new ways to do things. Trying new ideas can be messy and will involve failures, but it's what we are being called to in this new apostolic age.** I'll be sharing more about our plans for the future in the months ahead, but for now, please continue to pray for all of our parish evangelization efforts.

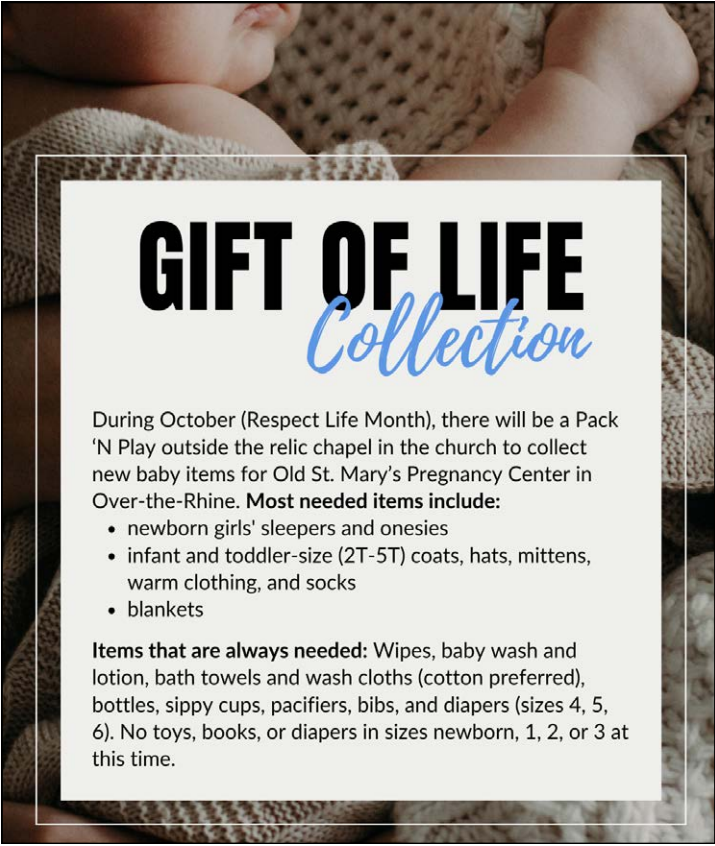

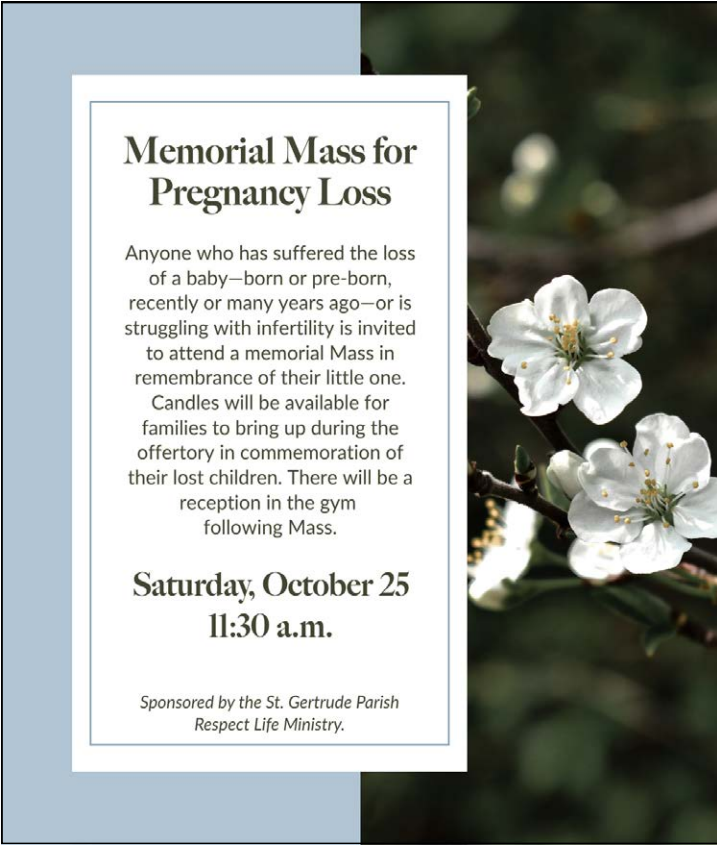
GIFT OF LIFE

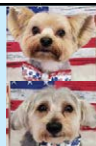


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
