Since Father John Paul was away on his annual retreat September 25 – October 2, Father Reginald, one of our parochial vicars, wrote the following article in place of Father John Paul's normal pastor letter.

ROSARY SUNDAY AND THE RESPECT FOR HUMAN LIFE

In Dominican circles, the first Sunday in October is known as Rosary Sunday. This title derives from an interesting history of the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary on October 7. As you may know, October 7 was originally known as the feast of Our Lady of Victory. It is the anniversary of the 1571 victory of the Christian naval forces over the Turkish fleet in the Battle of Lepanto. Pope Pius V had asked the whole of Europe to pray the rosary for victory. When the Christians defeated the Turks, he attributed that victory to Our Lady's powerful intercession and named the feast in memory of that event.

Just two years later, Pope Gregory XIII changed the name of the feast to the feast of the Most Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary. He also moved it to the first Sunday in October, so that more people would be able to celebrate it. His predecessor had formalized the number and content of the mysteries of the rosary, so Pope Gregory wanted to promote its devotion among the faithful. Three hundred and forty-two years later, Pope Pius X moved the feast back to October 7.

We Dominicans love the rosary—it's our "thing"! When St. Dominic received the rosary from Our Lady, what he received was a way to preach about—and meditate on—the goodness of creation. People had been using earlier forms of rosary beads to count Hail Marys before St. Dominic's time, but the genius that Our Lady added for him was to join that repetition of prayers to meditating on the mysteries of Christ's life. Meditation on the awesome reality that the Second Person of the most Holy (and ineffable!) Trinity had taken on human flesh. Had remade creation and declared it "good" once again, just as he had during the first six days of creation.

St. Dominic's mission was to preach to those who denied the goodness of the material world, as if it were evil, a drag on spiritual realities, which alone were good. The rosary was and is an important weapon to help combat that mindset, and it's a mindset we face today as well. How much self-hatred and shame are bound up with our image of our own bodies and the weakness we experience in our bodies? The rosary is a reminder that Jesus Christ became a human being and

sanctified our flesh. We no longer have any cause for shame or self-hatred.

Providentially, in the Catholic Church in the United States, this Sunday is also Respect Life Sunday. It kicks off Respect Life Month, just as Rosary Sunday begins the Month of the Rosary. The goodness of creation on which we meditate in the rosary is expanded upon as we promote the dignity and sanctity of human life at every stage.

"So God created mankind in His own image, in the image of God He created them; male and female He created them... and God saw that it was very good" (Genesis 1:27, 31).

This is the reality on which we meditate when we consider the mysteries of Christ's life. When he took on our flesh, he said again, "It is very good." He uses our flesh, our humanity, to sanctify us.

Our Lady of Victory, Queen of the Most Holy Rosary, Mother of God, pray for us!

Our Sacred Music Series continues on Friday, October 10, at 7 p.m. with an extraordinary program of


masterpieces by Mozart, Haydn, and Marianna Martines. This concert features our own Capella, alongside guest artists from Europe and musicians of the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra, bringing together an ensemble of remarkable beauty and power.

The Sacred Music Series has quickly grown in not only attendance but also reputation as a cultural icon within the city. Yet, its deeper purpose is not simply cultural—it is evangelical. The mission of the Church today takes many forms—service to the poor, teaching, witness in daily life. Sacred music, too, can be a path of evangelization. For some, an invitation to attend Mass may feel daunting, but through beauty, the doors of faith can quietly open. Music that has inspired believers for centuries can move hearts to encounter Christ in ways words alone cannot.

This October program shines a light on the Classical era of music, centered in Vienna, where Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, Marianna Martines, and Franz Joseph Haydn lived and worked. Each of these composers found patronage from the Church, and their works—elegant, radiant, and profound—continue to lift minds and hearts to God.

Marianna Martines' *Dixit Dominus* for chorus and orchestra brims with youthful brilliance and dramatic contrasts, revealing why she was so admired in her own day. Mozart's beloved *Exsultate*, *jubilate* for soprano soloist and orchestra—featuring British soprano Caitlin Harrison, who is joining us from Oxford, England—sparkles with joy and lyric beauty, culminating in one of the most radiant "Alleluias" ever written. The centerpiece of the evening, Haydn's mighty *Nelson Mass*, was composed in 1798 during a time of war and uncertainty. It is nicknamed after Admiral Horatio Nelson's victory at the Battle of the Nile. Its sweeping choruses and fervent cries of *Dona nobis pacem* ("Grant us peace") make it one of the most moving and powerful settings of the Mass ever composed, and it is a *tour de force* that will bring about the many extremes of human emotion.

I warmly invite you and your family and friends to join us for this concert. Together, let us celebrate the universality of the Church's tradition—music that transcends cultures and centuries, and that continues to draw people into the mystery of faith.






