2 Timothy 2:8–13

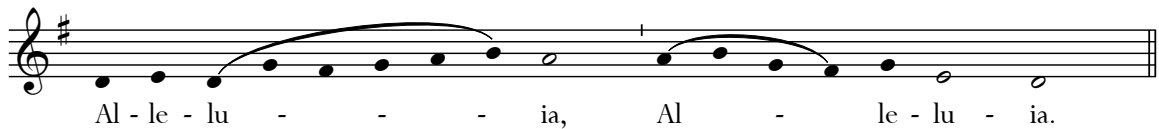

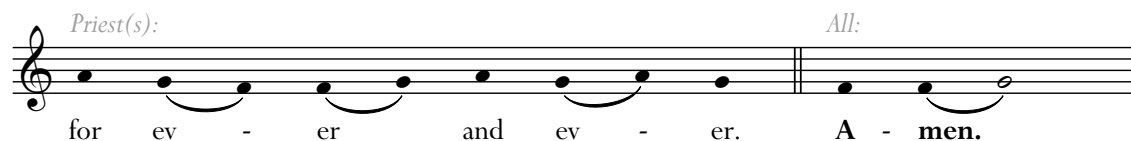
The celebrant says the Eucharistic Prayer. After the words of Consecration, the celebrant sings:

Amen.

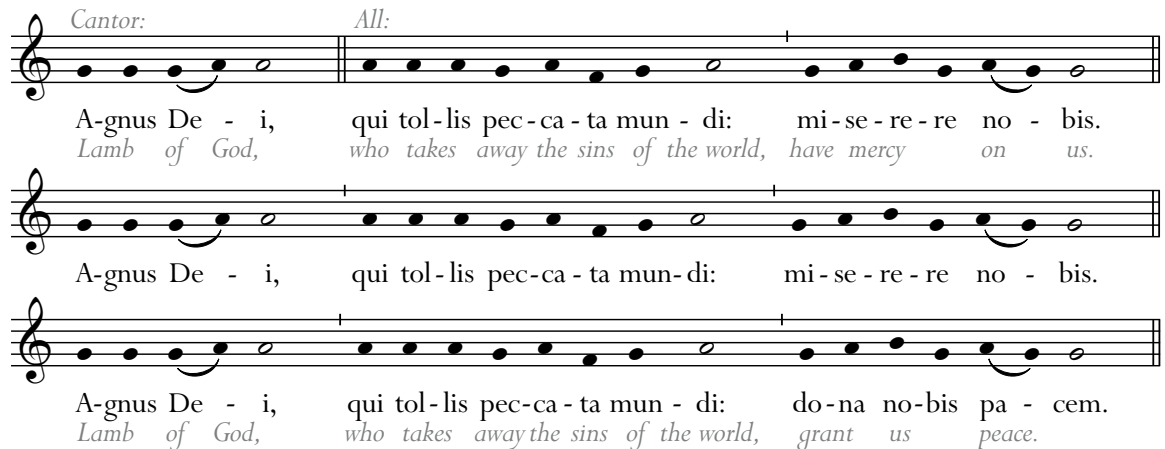
