FRUITFULNESS—PHYSICAL AND SPIRITUAL

One of the blessings we have here at St. Gertrude Parish is our large number of families with young children. An intrinsic part of marriage is an openness to God's gift of new life. We see evidence

of that openness every single day at our parish. (Quick note: Sometimes couples are very open to the gift of life and, for whatever reason, that gift has not been given, or not as often as it has been hoped for. Such couples are equally witnesses to marriage—and indeed powerful ones, as the cross of infertility or of struggles with fertility is a painful one to carry and points the rest of us to the cross of Jesus. Similarly, couples who have lost a baby, or more than one, during pregnancy give a powerful witness. The love for and grief you have over your little one is a testimony of your love for the gift of life.)

One reality of having a parish with so many small children is that, from time to time, a parent will decide he or she needs to take his or her little one out of the church for a period of time. I know from my own experience that when I'm walking around outside the church while another priest is celebrating Mass, I'll see moms and dads outside sitting on a bench with wailing children or trying to corral sprinting toddlers across the parish lawn. Recently, it struck us that, while sitting or chasing little ones outside may be okay when the weather is nice, that is probably not a pleasant option during the colder winter months. So, we've decided to experiment with something new. We will be live streaming the 8 a.m., 10 a.m., and 12 p.m. Sunday Masses to the main Parish Center lobby. That way, parents who need to take their children out of the church and wish not to use the church vestibule have an alternative location where they can still see and hear what is happening at Mass.

The physical fruitfulness of married love, while a good in itself, is also meant to point to the even greater good of spiritual fruitfulness and the new life we have in Christ as a result of our Baptism, when we first receive the gift of the Holy Spirit dwelling within us. When we are open and docile to the movement of the Holy Spirit, wonderful things manifest in our lives. St. Paul speaks about this in his letter to the Galatians: "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control" (Galatians 5:22-23). May all of us work each day to follow the promptings of the Holy Spirit within us, so as to manifest those fruits more fully in our lives.



40 DAYS FOR LIFE CAMPAIGN THANK-YOU MESSAGE

Dear 40 Days for Life Leaders and Participants:

We are very grateful to all who took part in the 2025 Fall 40 Days for Life campaign, either by sacrificing time and convenience to stand in public prayer witness in front of Planned Parenthood or by being united with them through prayers at home. If you stood on the sidewalk on a beautiful fall day or suffered through rain and cold, your sacrifice is noted in heaven. You helped keep the truth of the sanctity of human life before the public's eyes, and we pray it will lead to a change of heart for mothers, families, and abortion industry workers. We are especially in debt to your parish leadership for organizing this effort. Without their cooperation, there would be no campaign. Please thank them, if you can. The best thanks you can give them is to continue to take part in future campaigns (and our 365 initiative) when you are asked!

I don't know of any confirmed saves this campaign, but in the Week Six Update (available at cincinnatirighttolife.org), there's a story of a possible save. I'm also confident that because of your presence, even though we may not have confirmation this side of eternity, there are women who saw you praying and took it as a sign not to go through with an abortion.

We had a beautiful candlelight procession to Planned Parenthood as part of our closing event and were blessed to hear Ramona Trevino's testimony of her journey from Planned Parenthood director to reclaiming her walk with Christ. She spoke of the impact our 40 Days for Life peaceful, prayerful presence on the sidewalk has on those who are contemplating abortion and how often, without saying a word, the love of Christ touches women who take that presence as a sign to not go through with an abortion. What a confirmation that what we sacrifice to come to pray in public at the very place of the destruction of innocent life is a very good thing to do.

GET TO KNOW

St. Gertrude the Great



Early Life

Gertrude was born in Germany on January 6, 1256, the feast of the Epiphany, and was orphaned at an early age. A lovable and quick-witted child, Gertrude was taken to the Benedictine Abbey at Helfta in Saxony at the age of five to be educated by the nuns.

Upon completion of her studies in her mid-teenage years, Gertrude **entered the community of Helfta**. She was strong in character and personality and became a life-giving presence in the monastery.

Religious Life

On January 27, 1281, at the age of 25, Gertrude experienced her first vision—an **encounter with the risen Christ**, which she calls her "conversion." In the depths of her heart, she heard Christ say to her, "**Do not fear. I will save you and set you free.**"

Her visions altered her life, and she focused more on studying Scripture and theology and writing for the spiritual benefit of others. Gertrude embraced charity and had a deep love for those being purified in purgatory.

Prayer for Souls

St. Gertrude is invoked for souls in purgatory. Jesus told St. Gertrude that every time the following prayer is said, 1,000 souls would be released from purgatory. The prayer has been extended to include living sinners, too:

Eternal Father, I offer you the Most Precious Blood of Your Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the Masses said throughout the world today, for all the Holy Souls in Purgatory, for sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal church, those in my community, my home and within my family. Amen.

Legacy

In 1289, Gertrude heard Christ ask her to write an account of the many graces she had received. Reluctantly, she wrote a short spiritual autobiography, *The Herald of God's Loving-Kindness*.

Gertrude died on November 17 in 1301 or 1302. She is one of the great mystics of the 13th century, known for her devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the souls in purgatory. She was never formally canonized, but in 1606, Rome approved a liturgical office of prayer, readings, and hymns in her honor, equivalent of a canonization. Pope Benedict XIV gave her the title "the Great," making her the only woman saint to be called "the Great." Her feast day is November 16.





CATHOLIC CAMPAIGN FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT


