THE MULTIPLICATION OF . . . SIGNS (AND NOT THE SUPERNATURAL KIND)

We are moving through the time of year when many high schools are having their open house, preview days, and so forth. A

couple of weeks ago when I was taking a walk around the church property, I realized how many signs we had in our lawn. It struck me that the sheer number of signs made the church property look tacky, like a big advertising billboard, rather than dignified, as is fitting for a parish property. In addition, our own St. Gertrude Parish signs were getting lost in the sea of other signs advertising outside institutions.

In light of that, I had a discussion with our parish Family Leadership Team (FLT)—the top-level parish and school staff and we decided to institute a new policy regarding lawn signs. Since the majority of these signs promote various high schools, moving forward, we will no longer permit high school signs on our property. Any signs other than those produced by our parish (including our school) will only be allowed on a very limited basis and will require the personal approval of the pastor before being placed on our church lawn. Anyone wishing such approval will need to drop off your signs at the parish office, where (if approved) they will be marked as such before being placed on the lawn. Our facilities and maintenance staff, as they do their usual rounds around the property, will be directed to remove any signs not marked as having the pastor's approval. Again, the point of this is to keep our parish grounds looking dignified and to allow the signs we produce to truly stand out and attract attention so as to best promote what we are doing here at Saint Gertrude Parish.

One final note about lawn signs. In past years, I've received a number of angry phone calls or emails regarding various signs put on the grass right at the corner of Miami and Shawnee Run, promoting or advertising things not compatible with our Catholic teachings. Please realize that triangular section of lawn right at the intersection is *not* church property; it is owned by the City of Madeira. Thus, we have no control over what might be placed there. So if you ever see something there that you take offense to, please direct your calls or emails to the city, not to me.

A Brief Word of Thanksgiving

Before closing my letter this week, I would be remiss if I didn't acknowledge all those people who made our celebration of St. Gertrude's feast day so special. The music at the Mass was stunning with the combined Parish Choir and children's Schola—

they truly sounded outstanding together. And the party was a huge success, thanks to the leadership of Brian Farwick, who was this year's chair, and the rest of the pastoral council. For all who had any role in the weekend's festivities, please know of our gratitude for making it such a special celebration!



TRACING OUR PARISH ROOTS: ST. CECILIA, ST. GERTRUDE, AND THE DOMINICAN SISTERS Sister Mariana Thayer, O.P. Vice Principal, SGS

Earlier this week, the Church celebrated the feast of St. Cecilia, a third-century martyr and the heavenly patroness of the Dominican Sisters of St. Cecilia. Since St. Gertrude School opened its doors in 1934, the Dominican Sisters of St. Cecilia have joyfully served at SGS. Many parishioners have asked over the years: "Neither St. Gertrude nor St. Cecilia were Dominicans, so how did they become the patronesses of a Dominican parish and a Dominican congregation of sisters?

The answer beautifully takes us back to our beginnings. In 1923, the Catholics of the small Village of Madeira had no parish to call their own. With only a few families owning cars, traveling to the nearest church was difficult. One providential conversation at Harry Brinkkroger's hardware store on Camargo Road led a group of 35 local Catholics to petition Archbishop Henry Moeller for permission to celebrate Sunday Mass in a local home. He granted this request on November 25, 1923. Desiring a heavenly patron close to that original historic date, the founders chose St. Gertrude.

Just two years later, Archbishop John Timothy McNicholas, O.P., was appointed to the Archdiocese of Cincinnati.

Wanting to bring the charism of the Dominican Order to this young parish, he invited Dominican friars to staff St. Gertrude Parish. The first Dominican pastor arrived in 1927. Seven years later, the parish opened its school and welcomed the Dominican Sisters of St. Cecilia from Nashville, Tennessee.

The story of the Dominican Sisters of St. Cecilia stretches further back to 1860, when Bishop James Whelan—also a Dominican—invited four sisters from Somerset, Ohio, to establish an academy for girls with a special focus on music and the fine arts. St. Cecilia, the patroness of sacred music, was a fitting guide for this new congregation. Her connection to the early life of the Dominican Order makes her an even more cherished intercessor for us.

From their founding, the Dominican Sisters of St. Cecilia have held a profound love for beauty and the arts, knowing that the fine arts awaken wonder, elevate the mind, and draw the soul toward God. Here at St. Gertrude School, we see this truth daily in the work of Mrs. King and Ms. Pugliano in music and art, Mrs. Brizendine in theater, and in the thoughtful way our classroom teachers introduce students to inspiring poetry and literature.

As we reflect on St. Cecilia's feast, the sisters and I are filled with deep gratitude for our vocations, the privilege of serving in this parish, and the gift of forming young hearts and minds in the Dominican tradition. May St. Cecilia powerfully intercede for our entire St. Gertrude Parish and School community.



PASTORAL CARE

Are you or a loved one unable to attend Mass due to illness or being homebound? As a sign of Christ's love, our parish community earnestly desires to bring comfort and healing to these individuals. Please call the parish office at (513) 561-5954, and we will direct you to the most appropriate ministry.

Here are ways we can help you:

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

This healing sacrament is given to those facing serious physical or mental illness, advanced age, or surgery due to one of these. When one is near death, anointing is offered as part of the Last Rites, along with the sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist.

Communion to the Sick or Homebound

Our priests and lay ministers are available to bring Holy Communion to individuals who are unable to attend Sunday Mass due to illness or being homebound. This important ministry is a vital sign of the parish community's love and support for all of our members.

Prayers for the Sick or Deceased

Each week, our bulletin lists the names of individuals who are sick or recently deceased so that our entire parish community may pray for them. Simply contact the parish office to add yourself or a family member to this list.

PRAYER MINISTRY FOR THE DYING

Is your loved one actively dying? Contact our Prayer Ministry for the Dying. Members of this ministry pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet for those approaching death. 
