SOMETHING SHOULD BE DIFFERENT

I'm sure many of you might have reacted with a, "well that's a cryptic title" when you saw the title of my pastor column this week. You might be wondering about all the possible ways that

title could be interpreted. From my perspective, the title is meant to emphasize the fact that, as of this weekend, we are now in a different liturgical season of the year: Advent. At St. Gertrude Parish, you'll see the Advent wreath in the sanctuary, the priests wearing the familiar violet vestments at Mass, the absence of the *Gloria* at Sunday liturgies, and the singing of a whole new set of hymns to celebrate the season. Even though the change is not by any means terribly radical, anyone stepping foot into our church over the next four weeks will definitely know something is different. We've left Ordinary Time for something definitely out of the ordinary.

So I ask all of you: What about you? What about your family? What about your home? Will something be "different" over the next four weeks? I hope the answer for everyone is a resounding "yes!" I would encourage all of you to take advantage of this special liturgical season to do something different in your Catholic life. Maybe that means having an Advent wreath at home and lighting it for a period of time every night. Maybe it means deciding to spend time listening to the many beautiful Advent hymns. (Personal insight: of all the liturgical seasons of the year, my favorite—from the standpoint of hymns—is Advent!) It can sometimes be hard to find the hymns at home, but anyone interested can simply go to YouTube and do a search for "Advent Hymns," and plenty of options will pop up. I suspect the same might be true of the various streaming services out there. Advent calendars or the Jesse Tree are other options for celebrating this special season at home.

There is one other thing I would highly recommend to everyone in the parish. We are honored and blessed to be welcoming the nationally (and internationally) known group of Catholic musicians known as **The Vigil Project (TVP)** to our parish **this Wednesday evening, December 3.** They will be leading us in a deep dive into the spirituality of Advent through music, Scriptural readings, visual art, and Eucharistic adoration in a program called *Way of the Star.* TVP has been on the national stage multiple times recently, including being specially invited to perform at the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis last summer and at the celebration of the election of Pope Leo XIV held in Chicago in the days after his election.

We are blessed to have such an amazing group of faithful, amazing Catholic musicians coming here, but what many of you might not know is that one of the co-founders of TVP is one of our own St. Gertrude Parish parishioners, Andrea Thomas! Andrea was good enough to sit down with our bulletin editor and explain what the *Way of the Star* is all about; please see her reflection on page eight of this bulletin.

I absolutely love the season of Advent. I hope this letter has inspired many of you to want to grow deeper in your love of the season as well.

A WONDERFUL ADVENTURE Sister Mariana Thayer, O.P. St. Gertrude School Vice Principal

"Life with Christ is a wonderful adventure!" This quote from Pope St. John Paul II resonates deeply with me, but that wasn't always

the case. During these past 20 years as a Dominican sister, I have experienced the peace and joy that come from saying "yes" to God's plan, but there was a time when I questioned if religious life could truly lead to happiness. In eighth grade, I recall our parish priest pointing to a sister sitting in a nearby pew and suggesting that I, too, could be a sister. I turned to my mom and told her I would never be a sister! It was not until college that I began to think about my vocation.

My parish was hosting a weekend retreat, and my mom encouraged me to attend. Half-heartedly, I went and was amazed by what I saw. There was a group of priests who were young, happy, and normal. I didn't realize these qualities could coexist! I asked them many questions about their lives and signed up for an evening Holy Hour. It was at that Holy Hour that I first wondered if God could be calling me to religious life. But, I didn't know how to discern my vocation and was scared at the prospect of being a sister, so I tucked the idea into the

back of my mind and didn't give it any more thought. A few years later, the Lord began to gently knock on the door of my heart again. I had assumed that God was calling me to be married and have children, but I realized I hadn't asked him about my vocation. I was afraid of the answer.

At World Youth Day in Toronto in 2002, I received the grace to be open to God's will for my life. In his homily, Pope St. John Paul II said not to be afraid if God is calling you to give him your entire life. At that moment, I understood something fundamental to my vocational discernment: God would never call me to something that would make me miserable. In fact, whatever he was calling me to would bring me the greatest joy this side of heaven because he fashioned my heart for it.

I learned about the Dominican Sisters of St. Cecilia not long after that and visited the Motherhouse in Nashville. I still had many apprehensions, so I knew I needed to see it for myself. While there, I quickly recognized that the sisters' joy was authentic and that I felt like I was at home. I visited a few other orders and continued to frequent the sacraments. Through prayer and the wise counsel of a spiritual director, I discerned that God was calling me to enter our congregation.

The joy that I experienced on my first visit has only deepened each year I spend giving myself entirely to Jesus and to his Church. The adventure that he has designed for me far surpasses what I could have imagined on my own!



MAKE TIME FOR HIM THIS ADVENT

It was December 2000. My eighth grade year at St. Gertrude School was underway, and we were preparing for the much-anticipated

Christmas pageant, excited to be part of the nearly 70-year SGS tradition. I remember rehearsing my lines and practicing my solo as the Angel Gabriel. So much preparation. So much anticipation. And if I'm honest . . . so many nerves. The pageant night came, and the class of '01 held our own. The applause sounded, we took a bow, and went to Graeter's for a nightcap.

Now, 25 years later, that memory returns to me as I prepare, once again, for an event at St. Gertrude Parish. This time, I'm preparing not with my 8th-grade classmates, but with my team of musicians at The Vigil Project. Full circle moments in life are funny, aren't they?

Suboptimally, this combination of preparation, anticipation, and nerves seems to have followed me in my professional endeavors. Over the years, I have begged God to remove the nerves, but they have somehow healthily maintained themselves. There has been an unforeseen blessing in being nervous: it reminds me that God is ultimately in control even when I am uncomfortable or things seem amiss. In a performance-based culture, I am reminded that he desires time with me, more than anything I can do. Should we dare to make space, even a short time with him can accomplish more than we can achieve in a lifetime by ourselves.

But do we make the space to encounter him? Do we take the time?

I want to invite you to take time to encounter Jesus this Advent, right here at St. Gertrude Parish, on Wednesday, December 3, at 7 p.m.

As a member of St. Gertrude Parish, I am overjoyed to bring my colleagues from The Vigil Project to the place I call home. The event is called *Way of the Star*, a night of music and prayer in preparation for Advent. This is an album and live-event experience that we wrote, inspired by the Way of the Cross devotion prayed during Lent. We will journey together for 90 minutes through the "stations" of the nativity story in lectio divina-style prayer, paired with sweeping instrumental and vocal music written to accompany the Scriptures like a soundtrack. The evening is made all the more beautiful with sacred art painted for this specific experience, and the night culminates in Eucharistic adoration—Emmanuel, God with us!

We first toured with this event throughout Europe in 2023, and then throughout the United States in 2024. It was originally written for a community in Italy as a means of connecting our universal Church beyond language, using the great gift of music, from soaring instrumental string melodies to simple, repeatable and powerful refrains.


In paragraph 2562, the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* tells us that it is the whole man who prays. God created us as integrative beings, meaning that our emotions, intellect, imagination, and physical bodies all work together. We can't divorce them from each other, even if we try. Incense, music, and beautiful artwork engage our senses, and God very much comes to us by means of these! There is a reason we are stopped in our tracks by a gorgeous sunset or a stunning piece of music. We were made in beauty, by beauty, and for Beauty himself. It quite literally resonates with us on a cellular level! I don't have the time or space to expound on that (the science is called *cymatics* for the fellow nerds), but the point is that immersing ourselves in the beauty of these elements can be a powerful way to encounter God. It is the whole man who prays.

I didn't know it then, but my excitement as an 8th grader wasn't just about Christmas nostalgia and getting to sing a solo. I was drawn to the reality that music can accompany the season and guide my heart in a particular way. That's what *Way of the Star* is intended to do. A huge part of The Vigil Project mission is to reclaim artistic excellence in the Church and help people pray deeply with music. Thank you to Father John Paul, Michelle Dushensky, and the entire team here at St. Gertrude Parish for making it possible for us to come. This event is intended for the entire parish, so please know that all ages are welcome! I look forward to seeing what God has in store for us on December 3. And beyond a grace-filled night of music and prayer, I may need to heed tradition and convince my colleagues to join me in making Graeter's our nightcap.






