
PENITENTIAL ACT




CELEBRATION OF BAPTISM

INTRODUCTION

The celebrant invites the catechumen and his godparents to come forward.



All kneel and sing:



COLLECT

Almighty ever-living God, be present by the mysteries of your great love and send forth the spirit of adoption to create the new peoples brought to birth for you in the font of Baptism, so that what is to be carried out by our humble service may be brought to fulfillment by your mighty power. Through Christ our Lord.

Amen.

BLESSING OF BAPTISMAL WATER

The celebrant blesses the water to be used for baptism.

RENUNCIATION OF SIN AND PROFESSION OF FAITH

The celebrant invites the catechumen to profess his faith and renounce sin. At each question, he responds: I do.

RITE OF BAPTISM

The catechumen approaches the baptismal font with his godparents and is baptized.

CLOTHING WITH A WHITE GARMENT

The celebrant gives the newly baptized the white garment, symbolizing his new life in Christ and his soul cleansed from Original Sin.

HANDING ON OF A LIGHTED CANDLE

The celebrant gives the newly baptized a candle, symbolizing that he has received the light of Christ and is called to live as a child of the light.

RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL PROMISES

The celebrant invites the congregation to profess their faith and renounce sin. At each question, all respond:

I do.

CELEBRATION OF RECEPTION

INTRODUCTION AND INVITATION

The celebrant calls forth by name those to be received into full communion with the Church, inviting them to profess the Catholic faith.

PROFESSION AND RECEPTION

The candidates publicly profess their belief in all that the Catholic Church teaches. The celebrant then approaches each candidate and receives them into full communion with the Church.

CELEBRATION OF CONFIRMATION

INTRODUCTION AND LAYING ON OF HANDS

The celebrant introduces the rite of Confirmation and calls upon the Holy Spirit via the laying on of hands.

ANOINTING WITH CHRISM

The celebrant makes the Sign of the Cross with the Chrism on the forehead of the candidate, saying:

 N_{\bullet} , be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

Peace be with you.

And with your spirit.

Proceed to the Universal Prayer on page 15.

CREDO All stand

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

All bow

All stand

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead

and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Each petition concludes with:

Let us pray to the Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

After the final petition, all say:

Almighty Father, you have created us for some definite purpose. Grant us the grace to know the path you have planned for us in this life and to respond with a generous "Yes."

Make our archdiocese, parishes, homes, and hearts fruitful ground for your gift of vocations. May our young people respond to your call with courage and zeal.

Stir among our men a desire and the strength to be good and holy priests.

Bless us with consecrated religious and those called to a chaste single life, permanent deacons, and faithful husbands and wives, who are a sign of Christ's love for His Church.

We commend our prayer for vocations to you, Father, through the intercession of Mary our Mother, in the Holy Spirit, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

We lift them up to the Lord.


Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.




The celebrant says the Eucharistic Prayer. After the words of Consecration, the celebrant sings:




