# CHRISTMAS GREETING AND PRAYERS

On behalf of all the Dominican friars and the entire St. Gertrude Parish staff, I would like to extend my heartfelt wishes to you and your loved ones for a very merry and blessed Christmas. We

are so happy that you are able to join us for the celebration of this most holy feast. And indeed there is so much to celebrate as we gather this Christmas. For "a child is born for us, a son is given us" (Isaiah 9:5), and this child is the hope of all the world. This is the day when we are called to hear anew the words the angels spoke to the shepherds in the field that first Christmas night: "Do not be afraid; for behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For today in the city of David a savior has been born for you who is Messiah and Lord. # SPIRITUAL ECUMENISM: SEEKING UNITY IN TRUTH

Two years ago, Glenmary Home Missioners, where I serve as the director of ecumenism, hosted an event at the Cathedral Basilica of St. Peter in Chains. Rather crassly

entitled, "How Is One Saved?", the event brought together Lutherans, Baptists, and Catholics to discuss the topic of justification. Theologians from the aforementioned communions presented papers on the topic. We prayed together, listened to conversations between the presenters, and took questions from the audience, which numbered over 150 people—greatly exceeding our expectations and our space!

Following the event, many guests lingered to continue the conversation. For many Baptists I spoke with, this was the first time they had ever entered a Catholic church. For the Catholic seminarians present, this was the first time many of them had heard the theology of another tradition presented in this way. Judging by the fact that we had to ask people to leave at the end of the night, it was clear that both the topic-the original theological debate which has separated the Church in the West for 500 years—and the conversation were important, urgent, and of deep interest. I recall speaking to a young Catholic man who thanked me for the evening. He shared that this topic is one he and his Reformed Protestant parents talk about often, except with more yelling! He was glad to see how we modeled this conversation of truth-seeking on a topic that has divided both the Church and his family. In this way, there was a kind of conversion that happened for this man and for his parents, who were also present at the event.

In my role, I often get asked, "What is the goal of ecumenism? If it is full structural and sacramental unity, which it is, then how do we get there? Isn't this issue so big and complex that others should deal with it—theologians, clerics, heads of communions?" The thing about ecumenism is that it is a ministry most Catholics engage in every day but rarely in the spaces that get the attention. Instead, it happens regularly in the workplace, in schools, at sporting events, in neighborhoods, and, like the example I provided above, in families. In this way, ecumenism is the ministry of every baptized believer for whom Christ prayed that we might be one as he and the Father are one (John 17:21). So, what does this ministry look like for those who unknowingly engage in it every day?

To answer this question, the Second Vatican Council and its Decree on Ecumenism (Unitatis Redintegratio) are instructive. Catholics (actually all Christians) are encouraged to engage in what they call Spiritual Ecumenism, which is an emphasis on a continual "change of heart and holiness of life" along with a commitment to "public and private prayer for the unity of Christians" (Unitatis Redintegratio, 8). This Spiritual Ecumenism, the Council Fathers say, is the "soul of the whole ecumenical movement." Of course, we are seeking a unity in truth, who is the person of Christ, so we must avoid a false peace. But in highlighting the centrality of prayer and holiness, we see that, at the root, our unity as Christians is a gift of the Spirit. It is this gift that will allow us to be recognized as what we are, Christians. And, as Christ reminds us, others will know we are his disciples when we love one another, which, as anyone has experienced, requires much prayer.



# A SACRED YEAR: CHRIST'S PRESENCE IN THE LIFE OF OUR SCHOOL

As we enter the holy season of Christmas, I write with a heart full of gratitude. This sacred time invites us to pause, give thanks,

and marvel at the quiet and holy ways God has been at work among us.

In his abundant goodness, the Lord has blessed our parish with nearly one hundred years of academic excellence and faithful witness. Since 1934, the Dominican Sisters of St. Cecilia have poured out their lives in service to our community, forming generation after generation of young Catholics. Their vocation as teachers is not simply a profession, but a mission: to hand on the fullness of our faith, to shape minds and hearts for Christ, and to help children discover their dignity as sons and daughters made in the image and likeness of God.

We are also profoundly grateful for the Dominican Friars of the Province of St. Joseph, whose spiritual fatherhood, preaching, and sacramental ministry animate the life of our parish and school. Together, the friars and sisters offer a rare and beautiful witness. St. Gertrude School (SGS) is one of only two schools in the entire country where Dominican friars and Dominican sisters serve side by side. Their living presence breathes into our parish the four great pillars of Dominican spirituality: prayer, study, community, and preaching. This is the Dominican difference.

This year, we found language for something our community has lived for generations: the Dominican difference. It is not a slogan or a strategy, but a reality that has long shaped the rhythm of life at St. Gertrude School. It is woven into the very fabric of our school and quietly revealed in the ordinary, faithful moments of each day. At St. Gertrude School, education is never reduced to academics alone. It is the formation of the whole person: mind, heart, body, and soul, ordered toward what is true, good, and beautiful—and ultimately to Jesus Christ.

We see this formation most clearly lived in our students. This year, many of our middle school boys chose to gather each morning in the chapel before class began, kneeling side by side, to pray the rosary. There is no program requiring it, no announcement drawing attention to it—only the simple desire to place their days in the hands of Our Lady and her Son. In

moments like these, we witness something sacred taking root. What our children hear proclaimed from the altar on Sunday surely finds a home in their daily lives during the week. And in quiet, faithful ways, they learn to carry Christ with them, into their families, their friendships, and the world entrusted to their care

This year, we have been blessed with a record number of applications for the 2026–2027 school year, a powerful reflection of the trust families place in the formative education their children receive at St. Gertrude School. We also introduced our Preschool Pups Storytime program for parish families with little ones ages 18 months to five years old. This Christ-centered alternative to secular storytimes allows children to encounter a foretaste of SGS rhythms through story, song, and friendship.

It has been a particular joy to welcome parish families who may not have otherwise had the opportunity to step inside these school walls. To walk with them, to listen to their stories, and to share in prayer has been a quiet and beautiful gift. In God's providence, these encounters have begun to bear visible fruit, and we are grateful to see new life and renewed trust reflected in the growth of our enrollment.

As we look ahead to the coming year, we do so with hope and confidence, not in ourselves, but in the Lord who has been so faithful to our parish for nearly a century. St. Gertrude School exists first and foremost to serve the families of this parish—to hand on the faith, to form disciples, and to ensure that the light of Christ continues to burn brightly in this community for generations to come. This mission endures only through the prayerful and generous support of our parishioners, who so faithfully uphold this work as their own. We entrust our students, our families, and our future to the Christ Child born in Bethlehem, asking him to bless our parish, sustain our school, and make St. Gertrude Parish a lasting sign of his truth, his goodness, and his love.




