A TALE OF TWO ADVENTS

As I am sure most of you—well, hopefully *all* of you!—are aware, we are currently in the liturgical season of Advent. We often think of Advent as the season of preparation before Christmas. Which it is . . . partially.

But when we dig deeper and examine the season more closely, Advent is really two seasons. During the upcoming week—Wednesday, December 17, specifically—is the official "crossover" point where Advent makes a decided shift.

Rather than calling Advent the season of preparation before Christmas, it is really more accurate to call Advent the season where we prepare for the coming of Christ to Earth. With that as our overarching understanding of this liturgical season, the tale of two Advents comes into clearer view.

During the beginning portion of Advent, roughly the first two to three weeks, there are only occasional references to the coming celebration of Christmas and how Christ first came to Earth as the baby in the manger. During this first part of Advent, the focus instead has been on how Christ will come to the earth once again, his second coming, at the end of time. This is the focal point of many of the readings, both at daily and Sunday Masses, and is also very evident in the Preface to the Eucharistic Prayer that is prayed at every Advent Mass from the beginning of the season until December 16. One portion of this Preface is especially beautiful:

"...that, when he comes again in glory and majesty and all is at last made manifest, we who watch for that day may inherit the great promise in which now we dare to hope."

These last weeks, therefore, the Church has been calling us to remember "the great promise" in which we hope, and to "watch for that day" when, in glory and majesty, Christ will return to the earth and all will at last be made manifest.

However, beginning on December 17—one week out from Christmas Eve—everything changes. The Church begins shifting our attention to the first coming of Christ in Bethlehem. The weekday readings, this coming week in particular, are filled with the various Old Testament prophesies of the coming of the Messiah, and the Gospel readings begin telling the story of the Savior's birth. We also begin using Advent Preface II, which emphasizes this new focus:

"For all the oracles of the prophets foretold him, the Virgin Mother longed for him with love beyond all telling, John the Baptist sang of his coming and proclaimed his presence when he came.

It is by his gift that already we rejoice at the mystery of his Nativity, so that he may find us watchful in prayer and exultant in his praise."

During this last week before Christmas, let us all do our best to long for him "with love beyond all telling" and to remain watchful in prayer, so that we may rejoice with indescribable joy when we gather to celebrate his birth less than two weeks from now.

HELPING MEN ORDER ALL THINGS TO CHRIST

The Advent season is here, casting a spotlight on the three members of the Holy Family and their journey to Bethlehem. There is no question that Our Blessed Mother

and the Christ Child take prominence in this story, as shown in so many artistic depictions of the Nativity scene. Yet, this pivotal moment in salvation history can be credited, in part, to the protection offered by the least known of the three members: St. Joseph. In recent years, I—along with other St. Gertrude Parish men—have developed a personal devotion to this humble saint and foster father of Jesus as a member of the St. Joseph Society (SJS).

My initial connection with the SJS came in August 2021, prior to our family joining St. Gertrude Parish. Through an invite from my brother-in-law, I attended my first meeting, which was led by Mike Mason, Travis Johnson, and other like-minded laymen pursuing a deeper spiritual life through the model of St. Joseph. Seeing so many devout men taking their faith seriously left an instant impression on me. My wife and I were so touched by the entire St. Gertrude Parish community that we joined the parish that same year.

The St. Joseph Society is a lay apostolate with the mission to help men "order all things to Christ" by developing lives of virtue through **mind**, **body**, **and spirit**. This mission is put into action through our Rule of St. Joseph, which consists of daily and monthly practices meant to foster virtue in these three areas.

Mind - We make a firm commitment to intellectual, theological formation twice per week.

Body – We make a firm commitment to physical training three times per week, abstaining from meat every Friday, and periodic fasting throughout the year.

Spirit – We make a firm commitment to a prayer regimen every day, monthly adoration and confession, and observance of a Holy Sabbath. The following prayers are the foundation of our daily prayer regimen:

- Morning Prayer Morning Offering of Our Lady of Mount Carmel
- Midday Prayer Memorare to St. Joseph for the intentions of the society
- Evening Prayer Act of Contrition
- Reading sacred Scripture, mental prayer, and daily rosary

On the first Saturday of each month, we gather at St. Gertrude Church at 5:30 a.m. for a Holy Hour and confession, followed by fellowship and discussion that wraps up around 7:30 a.m. With spiritual guidance from Father Luke VanBerkum, we cover topics from spiritual theology to the various ways we can be stronger leaders for our families and the broader community. Along with our monthly meeting, SJS provides spiritual formation through weekly podcasts centered around growing in the interior life (see stjosephsociety.org for more details).

Finally, our patron saint's significance in Catholic tradition is summarized well in the Litany of St. Joseph. Titles such as "Terror of Demons," "Protector of the Holy Church," and "Head of the Holy Family" express his significance to the Church. As Catholic men, we are called to follow St. Joseph's lead—characterized by consistent prayer, self-sacrifice, and saying yes to God's will.

All men interested in learning more about the St. Joseph Society are welcome to come to our next meeting on Saturday, January 3, at 5:30 a.m to experience the society first-hand, or you can visit stgertrude.org/stjosephsociety or scan the QR code to contact our group and learn more.










ADVENT IN A WORLD THAT REFUSED TO WAIT

Recently, I lamented to my wife how difficult it is to enter and live in the season of Advent. To more fully embrace the spirit of preparation and the coming of

Christ is, no doubt, fraught with challenges. While the Church exhorts us to this end, our consumeristic, sappy, and secular culture lures our focus, steals our silence, and replaces the quiet, prayerful, and peaceful with noise, freneticism, and a steady undercurrent of holiday-season delicacies, distractions, and disruptions.

Believe me—I get it! Some of the trappings of rushing headlong into Christmas, months before December 24, are unavoidable and beyond our control. Society and popular culture have a growing allergy, it seems, to anything that honors self-restraint, self-denial, or just merely waiting on the right day and time. I don't want to make excuses here, but the reality is that this is the society that we live with and live in, and while sometimes we wish we could, none of us lives under a rock.

Beyond just complaining about the difficulties of living in Advent, what do-I try to do? *Something*. I try to do *something*, as doing something is better than doing nothing at all. I try to incorporate into my daily routine some act of penance, some devotion, or some prayer that pulls me away from the distractions and noise and helps to focus my attention on the *adventus* ("coming") of Christ. As a family, we decided to give

up watching television. Yikes! During the week, this is a manageable feat and fairly easy to pull off. The rubber hits the road (or things "get real") on the weekends, especially with an endless stream and heavy dose of nostalgic Christmas movies and those oh so important and final football games aglow. It was our two oldest children who came up with the idea of giving up television during Advent, I am very proud of them for suggesting it.

As an aside, it dawned on me during my lamentation about Advent that, even as we wait with anticipation for the feast of Christmas, the Church, in her wisdom, gives us big and little tidbits and tastes here and there and celebrations along the way. I'm thinking of the feasts of St. Nicholas, Our Lady of Guadalupe, St. Lucy, and above all, the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, which we just celebrated this past Monday, December 8.

So, as we more deeply enter into the Advent season, I encourage you, if you have not done so already, to *do something*. There is still time. Do something with your family and do something yourself to prepare your mind, body, and heart for the coming of Christ. Do something to "prepare the way of the Lord" and for the celebration that is sure to come.




