THE MOTHER OF THE FAITHFUL PEOPLE OF GOD

A little over a month ago, the Vatican Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith, with the approval of Pope Leo XIV, issued a document entitled *Mater Populi Fidelis* ("Mother of the Faithful

People of God," MPF). The primary goal was to address the role of Mary's cooperation in the work of salvation while also addressing the use of some titles for Mary that have been emphasized in popular Marian devotion, especially over the past decades. Two of these titles are Mary as "Co-redemptrix" and Mary as "Mediatrix of All Graces." Since at least the pontificate of Pope St. John Paul II, there have been calls and petitions to Rome to define these as dogmas of the faith via papal infallibility. Rather than do that, the document did much the opposite, banning these two titles from official Church documents. I'd like to explore why this document was issued and clarify what it says, and doesn't say, about these two titles and about Our Lady more generally.

The document is rather long for a dicastery document (80 paragraphs; about 20 pages if printed on standard letter-sized paper) and contains 197 theological footnotes. What follows is my best attempt to distill the document to its most central points.

First, it is important to understand that there is a pastoral, more than a theological, motive for the document. "Yet, these titles some of which already appear in the writings of the Church Fathers—are not always employed precisely, and their meanings are sometimes altered or misinterpreted. Beyond terminological issues, some titles pose significant difficulties regarding their content because they can often lead to a mistaken understanding of Mary's role, which carries serious repercussions at the Christological, ecclesiological and anthropological levels" (MPF, 2). It continues, "The present document, without intending to be comprehensive or exhaustive, seeks to maintain the necessary balance that must be established within the Christian mysteries between Christ's sole mediation and Mary's cooperation in the work of salvation, and it seeks to show how this is expressed in various Marian titles" (MPF, 3).

Our human experience tells us that "Co-redemptrix," is a confusing title. For example, if I am in a summer softball league and my team and another team are co-champions, what does that convey? That we are equally champions. In this sense, someone hearing the assertion that Mary is "Co-redemptrix" could easily get the mistaken (and heretical) impression that

she and Christ are equally responsible for our redemption! The document states: "This title risks obscuring Christ's unique salvific mediation and can therefore create confusion and an imbalance in the harmony of the truths of the Christian faith, for 'there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved' (Acts 4:12). When an expression requires many, repeated explanations to prevent it from straying from a correct meaning, it does not serve the faith of the People of God and becomes unhelpful."

Regarding the title "Mediatrix of All Graces," the document points out that, "Some titles, such as 'Mediatrix of All Graces,' have limits that do not favor a correct understanding of Mary's unique place. In fact, she, the first redeemed, could not have been the mediatrix of the grace that she herself received. This is not a minor point since it reveals something central: even in Mary's case, the gift of grace precedes her and comes from the absolutely free initiative of the Trinity in view of Christ's merits. Like all of us, she did not merit her justification by a preceding action of her own, nor did she do so by any subsequent action" (MPF, 67). The document instead repeats the formulation used by the Second Vatican Council, which called Mary "Mother in the order of grace" (MPF, 71; citing Lumen Gentium, 61).

It is important to note that there are ways these titles can be properly understood. Mary as "Co-redemptrix" is theologically sound if, by "co-," we understand her not in any way equal to, but instead as "uniting herself with" her Son in his work of divine redemption. Her title as "Mediatrix" can accurately be understood if it is acknowledged that her "mediation" with respect to us neither takes away nor adds anything to Christ as the sole mediator between God and man (1 Timothy 2:5), but that she, being the recipient of a special gift from her Son, accompanies the Lord's work by her special maternal intercession (cf. MPF, 65). However, going back to the pastoral aim of the document, it is rare that such nuances of these titles would be understood by many, thus leading to the potential for great confusion.


NEW MINISTRY TO PRAY FOR PRIESTS

















Handel's Messiah

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

This healing sacrament is given to those facing serious physical or mental illness, advanced age, or surgery due to one of these. When one is near death, anointing is offered as part of the Last Rites, along with the sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist.

Communion to the Sick or Homebound

Our priests and lay ministers are available to bring Holy Communion to individuals who are unable to attend Sunday Mass due to illness or being homebound. This important ministry is a vital sign of the parish community's love and support for all of our members.

Prayers for the Sick or Deceased

Each week, our bulletin lists the names of individuals who are sick or recently deceased so that our entire parish community may pray for them. Simply contact the parish office to add yourself or a family member to this list.




