# A VENERABLE EPIPHANY TRADITION: CHALKING THE DOORS

Blessing houses at the beginning of the year, on or near the celebration of Epiphany, is a longstanding Church tradition that dates back

to the Middle Ages. Over time, this developed into a particular ritual, in which blessed chalk was used to mark the lintel above the front door (and, in some cases, above every door in the house).

Once again, we will have baskets of blessed chalk at the entrances to the church during this weekend's Masses. We invite every household to take one piece of blessed chalk to bless their house. If you still have your blessed chalk from last year, there is no need to take a new piece. There are a number of variations on the formula that a family can use for the occasion; the one below is short and simple, suitable even for families with small children (and thus small attention spans!). Longer, more elaborate forms of the blessing, which may include readings from Scripture, can easily be found online.

The blessing can begin with all present making the Sign of the Cross. The one leading the prayers then says:

The Word became flesh and made his dwelling place among us. It is Christ who enlightens our hearts and homes with his love. May all who enter this home find Christ's light and love.

The leader then says:

The three Wise Men, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar followed the star of God's Son who became man two thousand and twenty-six years ago. May Christ bless our home and remain with us throughout the new year. Amen.

The lintel of the front door (either outside or inside) is then marked with:

20 + C + M + B + 26

The blessing concludes with everyone present praying the following prayer together:

Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless all who live or visit here with the gift of your love. May we be blessed with health, gentleness, and kindness of heart. Fill us with the light of Christ, that we may grow in grace and in the love and knowledge of you. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Side note: There are two meanings to the three letters used in the inscription, which are interspersed between the numerals of the current calendar year. They refer first to the names of the three Wise Men (whom we celebrate visiting the Christ Child on the feast of the Epiphany): Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. The letters are also an abbreviation for the Latin phrase *Christus mansionem benedicat*—"May Christ bless [this] home."

#### ST. GERTRUDE PARISH CHOIRS ENGLAND TOUR AND GALA

Later this year, singers from St. Gertrude Parish's Parish Choir

and Schola Cantorum will travel to England on an extraordinary musical pilgrimage—not simply to perform concerts, but to serve as musical ambassadors of the Church in the United States. The choirs have been invited to sing with some of the most distinguished liturgical institutions in the English-speaking world, including St. George's Cathedral Southwark, the Catholic cathedral of London; New College; Winchester College; the Rosary Shrine and St. Dominic's Priory in London; and Blackfriars Hall, a major Dominican intellectual center in England and northern Europe. Through shared liturgy and sacred music, our singers will build relationships across Catholic and Anglican traditions, offering prayer in sound while representing St. Gertrude Parish, Cincinnati, and the wider American Church abroad.

Those of you who attend the 10 a.m. and 12 p.m. Sunday Masses have heard our choirs every week as they sing the great sacred music of the Catholic Church—plainchant, Palestrina, Mozart, and beyond. But if you have ever wondered what the musicians of St. Gertrude Parish sound like *outside* of the choir loft—or if you simply enjoy a fabulous night out with dinner, drinks, and live entertainment and want to support first-rate entertainment that benefits the arts and international musical-cultural exchange and ecumenical dialogue—you do not want to miss our Choir Gala and Variety Show on January 31 at 6:30 p.m. at St. Gertrude School.

To be clear: this is not a formal recital nor a typical fundraiser program. The evening will delight, surprise, and entertain from start to finish. Think of it as equal parts elegant dinner party, cabaret-style concert, and parish celebration—all in support of an extraordinary musical mission. The Variety Show is exactly that: a lively, expertly curated evening of music spanning Broadway favorites, operatic scenes, jazz standards, grand opera, and more, presented with warmth, wit, and flair. Performers include members of the Parish Choir, children of the Schola Cantorum, our high school choral scholars, and of course our professional staff singers, many of whom have performed on Broadway and at the Metropolitan Opera.

The evening begins with a catered dinner from Maggiano's, a favorite for good reason. Each guest will receive one complimentary drink ticket, with a cash bar available thereafter. The dress code is business casual—dress nicely, but

comfortably, and be ready to enjoy yourself.

**RETURN NIGHT**By Tyler Castrucci

For Catholic parishes, Christmas Mass is one of the most wellattended Masses of the year. St. Gertrude Parish is no exception.

Taking all our Christmas Masses into consideration, Christmas Mass attendance is typically 50 percent higher than our average Mass attendance on a regular Sunday. In real numbers, nearly 1,000 "extra" people show up on Christmas. That's an astonishing number! This bump in attendance certainly has something to do with the grace and enduring mystery of God becoming Man in the Person of Jesus Christ. But there is also a certain cultural "inertia" from longstanding traditions of going to church on Christmas. It's a day when many people who do not regularly attend Mass choose (for varied reasons) to show up. In short, Christmas is one of the rare times when a "fallen away" Catholic (a person who is not regularly practicing their Catholic faith) might choose to come to Mass. This, in and of itself, is a good thing and a result of God's grace. It also presents an opportunity for evangelization.

I've been reflecting on this reality—specifically how we, as a parish, could welcome someone who has fallen away and invite him or her to return. To be honest, we haven't really had a lot of options at St. Gertrude Parish. This year, we would like to try something different. On Wednesday, January 14, from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m., we will host Return Night. This is an evening specifically designed for what we think fallen-away Catholics might need: community, friendship, a joyful proclamation of

the Gospel, and an opportunity to encounter Jesus in prayer and/or confession.

Fellowship of Catholic University Students (FOCUS) missionaries have a simple way of describing the process of evangelization: Win, Build, Send. Return Night is firmly in the "Win" category—all we want to do is reintroduce people to Jesus and his Church. The evening will include dinner, conversation, a kerygmatic talk, a witness testimony, and the end of the parish Holy Hour, which will allow the fallen away to spend time with Jesus in the Eucharist and/or receive the sacrament of Reconciliation. I invite you to pray and ask the Holy Spirit to give you the name of a person in your life whom you could invite to Return Night . . . and then invite him or her to attend Return Night with you.

No matter what, please pray for all of the lost, the seekers, and the fallen away, who walked through our doors this past Christmas and for the success of Return Night. Here is a simple prayer you can use:

O Holy Spirit of Truth, we beseech You to enlighten the minds of unbelievers in the midst of us, to incline their hearts to love Your word, and to believe the teachings of Your Church.

Give them the courage to accept the faith and openly profess it; that they may come into union with You and the Father, through Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns forever and ever. Amen.






