THE POWERFUL IMPACT OF THE CATHOLIC MINISTRIES APPEAL

Dear Reader,

I am a prisoner in the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Corrections, and we have a Catholic instructions class within the prison put on by the Catholic Ministries Appeal. Recently, the Christmas Season came upon us, and as inmates, it is simply just another day of the week/year.

Marty Arlinghaus got some volunteers to change that mentality and help us celebrate the birth of Jesus with a feast and prayer. All the food they provided was either donated by their families or purchased by volunteers.

We had a lot of food—good food made with love and hope from the community of fellow Catholic believers from the Archdiocese of Cincinnati!

To celebrate, we had pizza, chips, soda, cheese balls, cookies, and sloppy joes. There were goodie bags of candy and sweets donated by a fellow parishioner, and fruit and veggie trays, all purchased and/or prepared by somebody within the Catholic churches in Cincinnati, Ohio.

This was the best day I've had in years, especially since being incarcerated. And all I had to do was learn about God and the Catholic Church! Wow!!

I wanted to bring a little awareness and appreciation to light and thank all the parishioners and Catholic churches of Cincinnati from all of us inmates here at Lebanon Correctional

Institution.

We appreciate all the volunteers and the nameless individuals who donated their money, time, and effort to help make us fellow parishioners feel so warm this Christmas. Thank you.

I speak for all the men at the Lebanon Corrections Catholic instructions classes. This worldly deed they did is the best show of love, charity, and devotion we have ever experienced.

May God continue to bless you!

MEET THE TEAM: APRIL DEOCARIZA

This past November, April Deocariza joined the St. Gertrude Parish staff as our evangelization administrative assistant. To help you get to know her, we asked April to share a little

about herself and her new role here at the parish.

St. Gertrude Parish: Would you please tell us about yourself?

April Deocariza: I am a Southern California native, born and raised in Los Angeles. My husband, Venancio, is also from SoCal and served in the U.S. Air Force (he retired in October 2025). Our military life brought us to Oklahoma City, Germany (where our son was born), back to Oklahoma City, and then to Cincinnati in 2022. We have been parishioners at St. Gertrude Parish since we moved here, and our son, Joseph, is in third grade at St. Gertrude School. A couple fun facts:

- The church around the corner from our home in Germany was also called St. Gertrude, and we would often run into the Dominican Sisters of St. Cecilia, who have a convent in neighboring Sittard, Netherlands.
- I first heard about the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS)—offered here at St. Gertrude Parish and School—back when we were still living in Germany. It's so exciting to see how worlds have collided for us here!

SGP: What drew you to the evangelization administrative assistant position, and what excites you about this role?

April: From the moment we arrived in Cincinnati, St. Gertrude Parish has been the focal point of our family's life. We are so grateful to have a life centered around the church. Each of us has experienced the fruits of the work being done at the parish: my son through his Dominican formation at school, my husband

through his men's group and the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, and me through the Walking with Purpose Bible study. This job has offered me the opportunity to continue to deepen my own formation while also giving back to the parish that has given my family so much.

SGP: What does your role entail?

April: There is so much going on at the parish, and that makes my role working in the Office of Evangelization and Faith Formation (OEFF) very busy and fun. It includes maintaining the parish database (especially as we prepare for the busy sacrament season), coordinating parish events and programs, sending funeral notification emails, updating social media, and running around campus posting communications and marketing materials—if you see me, please say hello!

SGP: What do you like to do for fun?

April: Our family loves to travel, and we've enjoyed getting to know all the different places our Air Force life has brought us. We have especially enjoyed exploring our new home here in Cincinnati and its surrounding areas, including attending FC Cincinnati games and the Cincinnati Open, catching shows at the Aronoff and Music Hall (I was a dance writer in a past life), and trying out new restaurants with friends. I also enjoy volunteering at St. Gertrude School and with my Walking with Purpose Bible study—shout out to my Wednesday night group!
