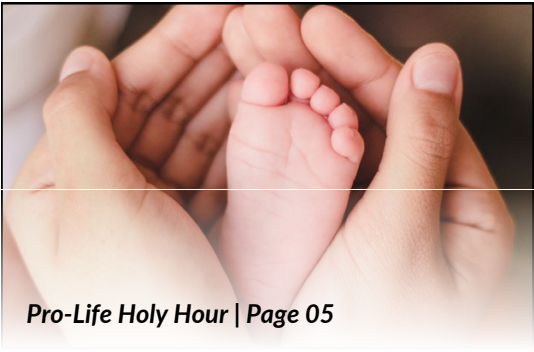

OUR PARISH MARDI GRAS CELEBRATION

A week from Tuesday, our parish will be having its fourth annual Mardi Gras Potluck dinner. We will have lots of food, New Orleans-style jazz music, plenty of

decorations and fun for the whole family. This gathering has quickly become one of the “parties” that the parish is known for. However, I realize people might have some questions about Mardi Gras, so I put together a little Q&A on the topic.

Why is a Catholic parish celebrating Mardi Gras? Isn't that some raunchy night of drinking and debauchery that happens each year in New Orleans?

Certainly, the manner in which Mardi Gras has been celebrated in New Orleans in recent decades is both infamous and, well . . . not exactly within our Catholic understanding of proper moral behavior. But Mardi Gras is celebrated in many countries, especially the traditionally Catholic countries of Western Europe and South America. In most of these countries, Mardi Gras (literally “Fat Tuesday,” i.e., the day before Ash Wednesday and thus the fasting of Lent) is simply the final day of what has been several weeks of celebration of Carnival, a time of rejoicing and festivity that begins on the feast of the Epiphany in early January and runs until Fat Tuesday. Mardi Gras is a Catholic celebration through and through!

Why a parish potluck?

The celebration of Carnival and Mardi Gras takes different forms in various countries, but there is always an emphasis on food. Since Lent is a season of fasting and abstinence, and many Catholics choose to “give up” one or more food items they particularly enjoy as a form of special Lenten penance, the weeks (and especially the final day) before Ash Wednesday are naturally a time to enjoy such foods before the time of fasting begins. In the context of our parish, what better way to have a “celebration of the goodness of food” than through a potluck? A potluck is a wonderful way for people to share a little bit about themselves with their fellow parishioners through the food they make for the purpose of sharing it with others.

What if I am not a good cook, don't like cooking, or don't have time to cook?

It doesn't matter! Come anyway. Bring something. Anything. Heck, stop off at a KFC and bring some fried chicken. Stop at a bakery and buy a package of nice dinner rolls. I don't want anyone to avoid coming just because he or she is self-conscious about his or her cooking. If you can't or don't want to cook, stop at the store and buy something to bring. Just come! I hope that everyone in our parish comes to enjoy this evening.

What if I don't know anyone in the parish? Am I going to be sitting at a table by myself, feeling awkward and out of place? Absolutely not!!! One of the purposes of a parish event like this is to help people get to meet and know each other. Along those lines, I encourage everyone in the parish to take advantage of the potluck to get to know some new people. Don't just sit with the same friends that you see all the time. Branch out. Sit at a table with someone you don't know. Introduce yourself. Hear his or her story of being at St. Gertrude (however long or short he or she has been here) and share your story. The more we all get to know each other, the stronger our parish will become.

Is the event “kid-friendly”?

Absolutely! Bring all the little ones. We'll have ways of helping even the smallest of our parishioners share in the fun. Also, it starts early (5:30 p.m.) so that families with small children can enjoy the celebration for a while before running into bedtime.

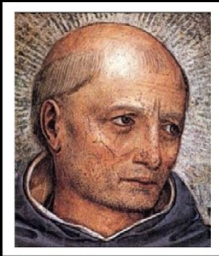

THE GIFT OF CATHOLIC EDUCATION: CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK REFLECTION

Last month, we joined with other communities across the United States celebrating Catholic Schools Week. This celebration traditionally falls around the feast of St. Thomas Aquinas, the great Dominican theologian and philosopher whose teachings have made such a deep impression on the whole Church that, 800 years later, he is still considered the Universal Doctor. Our school library is named for him and, along with St. John Henry Newman, he is the patron saint of all Catholic schools and students.

I have been blessed to study in Catholic institutions from kindergarten through high school, and also in graduate school. I am deeply convinced that the work of Catholic schools is a noble and holy work that truly changes the world—one life at a time.

For many families in the United States, choosing a Catholic education means choosing sacrifice. I remember a moment in high school when that reality came into focus for me. I asked my mom, almost casually, “If we didn’t go to Catholic school, would we be able to travel more and go on vacations?” She answered simply, “Yes.”

There was no disappointment in her voice and none in my heart. In that moment, we both understood the trade being made, and neither of us wished it were different. We would not exchange the transformative power of a Catholic education for fancier vacations. We would not trade a life formed around Jesus Christ at the heart of both our home and our school for something less.

Even then, I sensed something profound. My God-given gifts were able to take root and flourish because I was in a place where I was truly known, seen, and loved by people who recognized me not simply as a student, but as who I truly was, a beloved daughter of God the Father.

Thank you for entrusting your children to a Catholic school. You will not regret it. It is a privilege for us to partner with you in the formation and education of your children. May God help each of us become the saints we are called to be!

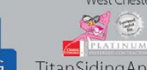
