IN HIS FOOTSTEPS

I recently found myself thinking about an old saying that I am sure many of you are familiar with: "Never judge a man until you have walked a mile in his shoes." The origin of it seems to be found in a

slight adaptation of a very similar line in Mary T. Lathrop's 1895 poem "Judge Softly." The point of that line, and indeed the entire poem, is to have empathy for the struggles of others rather than rushing to judge them, for we rarely know what unseen burdens they carry.

However, I found myself jumping from the line of that poem to one of the most beloved Catholic devotions that we emphasize in a particular way during the season of Lent, namely, the Stations of the Cross. In the prayers of the stations, we indeed "walk" in the very footsteps of Jesus Christ. Unlike so many of our Catholic prayers and devotions by which we reflect upon Jesus (or Mary or one of the saints) "from the outside," in the Stations of the Cross, we are invited to immerse ourselves in the mystery of Our Lord's passion and crucifixion "from the inside" by walking the very path he trod, with him, every step of the way, from his agony in the garden to his entombment.

The origin of this Lenten devotion dates back to the 13th century, when the Franciscans were given custody of the holy sites in Jerusalem. Pilgrims who traveled to the Holy Land would (quite literally) walk the path Jesus walked during his passion, stopping to pray at the various locations of key events.

In the centuries that followed, because so many of the faithful were unable to make a pilgrimage to the Holy Land, the Franciscans began building outdoor shrines that replicated the holy sites in Jerusalem so that many more of the faithful could participate in such a "walking in the footsteps of Christ." At that time, there was no "set" number of stations, and various shrines would have anywhere from as few as seven to as many as thirty stations. At these early shrines, it was most common for there to be life-sized statues depicting the mystery being recalled. Around the year 1700, the number of stations was fixed at the present-day 14, and in the mid-1800s, the pope permitted stations to be erected inside parish churches all



over the world. Since most churches were not large enough to have 14 stations with life-sized statues, it became common at that point for each station to be represented by a smaller image depicting each station.

We will be praying the Stations of the Cross as a parish every Friday of Lent at 7 p.m. in the church. It is my hope that everyone will be able to participate in this devotion at least once or twice during this sacred season. It provides a unique and beautiful way of walking in the footsteps of Christ and more deeply immersing ourselves in what Jesus endured for our salvation.

MEET THE TEAM: DEACON MIKE MUSE

At the beginning of the new year, Deacon Mike Muse joined the St. Gertrude Parish staff as a permanent deacon. To help you get to know Deacon Mike, we asked him to share a little bit about himself.

St. Gertrude Parish: Would you please tell us a little bit about yourself?

Deacon Mike Muse: I am a native Cincinnati who has come and gone from Cincinnati a number of times. Born and raised on the West Side, I went to Culver Military Academy in northern Indiana for high school. From there, I came back home and went to the University of Cincinnati. After college, I joined Contech Construction Products and moved around the country several times over 14 years—the only geographic area we have not lived in is the Pacific Northwest. During that time, I married Carrie, and we had our daughter, Lauren, while living in Charlotte, NC. After all of our moves, we came back home and now live in Loveland. Carrie and I have been married for almost 31 years, and Lauren has been a cardiac ICU nurse at Christ Hospital for two years.

I have worked in the area for 15 years. Before working for the Church, I was a plant manager and a director of operations. I ran plants that made corrugated steel pipe and drainage products, and started a new facility in New Jersey making plastic drainage pipe. I was a director of military service for Rollins, supporting Navistar Defense, and the director of manufacturing for Cincinnati Association for the Blind.

St. Gertrude Parish: What inspired you to become a deacon?

Deacon Mike: My faith journey is an interesting one. Baptized as a Methodist, I came into the Church in April 1995—one month before Carrie and I were married. I did RCIA with the pastor of a small church in Palmer, MA. We would sit in his rectory living room every Monday evening for two hours, talking about the faith and what it means to be Catholic. I recall pacing my apartment, trying to memorize the Hail Mary before one of our meetings!

My journey to becoming a deacon is one that I never imagined. After Confirmation, I continued to get promoted, and we moved with each new assignment. With each new plant came increased responsibilities and much longer hours. Missing Mass on Sunday was typical, as I was working seven days a week, 100 hours a week, for months at a time. It was not until moving back to Cincinnati, due to my mother's failing health, that I realized these long hours were causing me to not see my wife, and I was

missing seeing Lauren grow up. We joined St. Margaret of York Parish in Loveland, as it was the parish across from our neighborhood. I joined the Knights of Columbus and was asked to attend Christ Renews His Parish (CRHP, now Welcome). This experience changed my life and my direction. After CRHP, my family and I started attending regular Sunday Mass, joined some Bible studies, and got heavily involved with the Knights. I had a brief thought of the diaconate, but brushed it off after realizing the years of schooling it took. The thought continued to nag, but I needed to concentrate on work and family. It was Father Jan Schmidt, my pastor at the time, who asked if I had ever considered the diaconate. That was it—I registered for the Lay Pastoral Ministry Program at Mount St. Mary's Seminary and then applied for acceptance into the diaconate. I was ordained in 2019 and assigned to St. Gertrude Parish, where I spent two years. At the time, I was also the business manager. In fall 2020, I moved back to St. Margaret of York, as I had become SMOY's business manager. As I look toward retirement, I have settled down with Holy Family Parish in Clermont County as their business manager, and I just completed a master of arts in theology.

St. Gertrude Parish: What drew you back to the parish to serve as deacon again, and what are you looking forward to?

Deacon Mike: I love how vibrant this community is. This parish is so much busier and active than even five years ago and has experienced tremendous growth. People flock to good liturgy and a strong Catholic community—this is the reason why I wished to come back home! I am so happy to be back at St. Gertrude as the deacon. This has been such a huge blessing. I look forward to getting to know the families at St. Gertrude and to rekindling the relationships from my time five years ago.

St. Gertrude Parish: What will you be doing as deacon?

Deacon Mike: Father John Paul has asked if I would coordinate the extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion (EMHCs) and Communion to the sick ministries. I also work with those who need annulments and am the coordinator of the Love in Action committee, which is part of the Beacons of Light process. I work with Tyler in the baptismal prep classes, walking the couples through the actual baptismal rite after their class, and am the clergy liaison for the altar servers.




NEXT FUN BUNCH GATHERING—MARCH 17

EIGHTH GRADE CAPSTONE Catholic Apologetics Projects

This week, St. Gertrude School eighth grade students presented their capstone apologetics projects to the Dominican brothers and the broader school community. This impressive milestone marks the culmination of nine years of rigorous Catholic education and formation within our parish school.

The apologetics project is designed to bring together everything students have learned during their time at St. Gertrude School: habits of careful study, clear thinking, and a deep understanding of the Catholic faith. After extensive research, each student wrote a persuasive essay, addressing a question about Catholic teaching. They then created project boards and delivered formal oral presentations, defending their arguments before the Dominican friars and their teachers. Each presentation concluded with a question-and-answer session, during which students thoughtfully engaged challenges and responded to further discussion.

This process asks more of students than memorization. It invites them into the Church's rich intellectual tradition, where they learn to carefully examine questions, thoughtfully weigh evidence, and clearly and confidently articulate the truths of the faith.

For many students, this project becomes the fullest academic

and spiritual expression of their years at St. Gertrude School. After nearly a decade of daily prayer, study of the faith, and the witness of the Dominican sisters and friars, students are able to stand before others and explain what the Church teaches and, most importantly, why it is true.

The result is as striking as it is edifying. These young men and women speak about the faith not as something distant or abstract, but as something personally treasured.
