Jeremiah 20:10–13

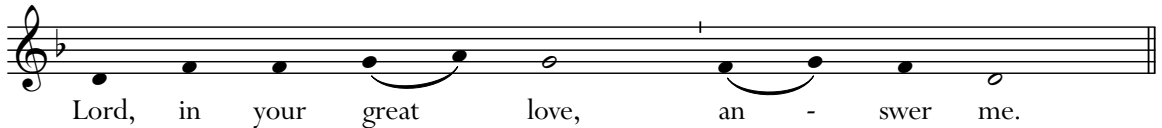

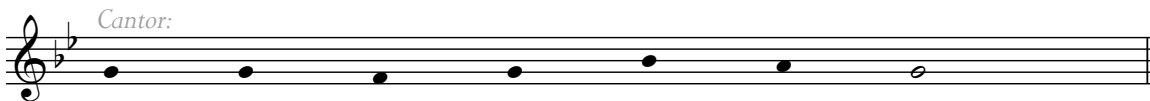


