CHECKING IN

After a relatively mild start to our summer, mother nature has slammed us with the full heat and humidity of summers in Cincinnati. Weather experts tell us that a “heat dome” has settled on us, and there doesn’t seem to be

any significant break from the current weather for a long while. With temperatures in the 90s and humidity through the roof, we have been seeing (and will continue to see) daytime heat indices (“feels like” temperatures) of 100 to 105 degrees or even higher. It seems every day my phone is buzzing with “Extreme Heat Warning” messages.

When watching the news during times of such extreme heat, it’s common to hear admonitions to be careful when outside, to drink lots of fluids, and to check in on neighbors—especially the elderly or anyone without air conditioning.

Check in on your neighbors . . .

Hearing that phrase repeated so many times in the past days got me thinking: *What if all of us made the commitment to “check in” on someone during the week ahead?* And I don’t mean “check in” in the way the TV announcers mean (though certainly if you know of anyone without A/C it would be an important thing to do), but in a broader sense. Here are a few suggestions to get you thinking about who you could commit to checking in on in the next week or two.

- Is there a family member I haven’t spoken with in “too long” whom I could call to see how he or she is doing?
- Is there a neighbor I used to see around a lot who recently seems to have fallen off the map?
- Do I know of anyone in recovery from an addiction who could use a word of encouragement?
- Did a friend confide in me a while back about a medical condition he or she (or one of his or her loved ones) is facing and from whom I haven’t heard an update?
- Do I know any moms who recently gave birth who may be struggling postpartum and might appreciate a listening ear?
- Who in my life do I know well enough to ask him or her how his or her spiritual life has been going recently?

While (almost) no one enjoys the brutal heat and humidity we are currently experiencing, perhaps when we do get such weather we can develop the habit of letting it remind us that every day is a good day to check in on someone else.

**ST. GERTRUDE CHOIRS
EXPERIENCE THE
UNIVERSAL CHURCH**

Between June 9 and 19, nearly 70 St. Gertrude Parish singers, family members, and supporters embarked on a choral pilgrimage to England centered in London, Oxford, and Maidenhead. The group included members of the Parish Choir, Schola Cantorum, Capella, and our high school choral scholars, all taking part in an unusually ambitious musical and spiritual undertaking.

Our choirs sang in a wide range of ecclesiastical settings. We encountered the English Province of Dominican Friars at St. Dominic’s Priory in London and the Chapel of Blackfriars Hall at Oxford University and benefited from the vast knowledge and spiritual care of Father Lawrence Lew, O.P., who served as our chaplain. The Schola Cantorum sang with the choirs of St. George’s Cathedral, Southwark, the principal Catholic cathedral of southern London, and in one of the world’s great ancient collegiate chapels, New College at Oxford University. We closed the tour with an ecumenical choral service at All Saints Church in Maidenhead, attended by children from local Anglican schools, and enjoyed a masterclass with Paul Leddington Wright, the renowned composer and recently retired choirmaster of Coventry Cathedral.

One of the tour’s most significant moments was the Schola Cantorum’s collaboration with the world-renowned Choir of New College at Oxford University for the service of Evensong: a rare and remarkable achievement of any American choir, no less one based in a parish. To the best of our knowledge, it marked the first collaboration of any American choir with New College in the UK. Members of Oxford’s music faculty praised our choristers’ musicianship, extraordinary tone, discipline, and responsiveness to the conductor. The prior of Blackfriars and the rector of the Rosary Shrine likewise remarked on the Parish Choir and the Schola’s poise, restraint, and careful preparation, noting that the choirs exceeded their expectations for visiting American ensembles.

This tour was conceived not merely as a concert trip, but as a pilgrimage of sacred music. Daily Mass, Dominican liturgical identity, chant, masterpieces of the choral repertoire, and visits to major churches formed the backbone of the experience. Father Lew, O.P., led guided tours of the sites of St. John Henry Newman to Littlemore, Oxford, and of the martyrdom sites of many English saints in London. The Parish Choir also commissioned and gave the world premieres of two newly composed works: a setting of a poem by the 14th century

mystic Julian of Norwich by Caitlin Harrison-Crane, and a setting of Psalm 84 by Caleb Kościecha. These commissions underscored St. Gertrude Parish’s commitment to not only preserving the Church’s musical patrimony, but also contributing to its future.

The singers encountered, firsthand, the living tradition of English choral foundations, Catholic and Anglican alike, while also bringing something distinctively St. Gertrude: disciplined preparation, theological seriousness, liturgical reverence, and a high standard of sacred music rooted in the parish’s Dominican character.

Musically, the tour highlighted the remarkable growth of the St. Gertrude Parish music program over the past four years. The Parish Choir sang with confidence and maturity in English parish, university, and cathedral contexts, while the Schola Cantorum performed at a level that allowed its young singers to credibly collaborate with ancient, renowned choral institutions abroad. Feedback from British hosts and conductors was highly positive, which is notable given the typically reserved nature of the English choral world.

Above all, the tour showed the depth of what has taken root in the St. Gertrude Parish choirs—not merely parish ensembles, but a sacred music apostolate capable of serving the parish, the Dominican tradition, and American Catholic choral life at the international level. For the choristers, families, and adult singers, it was a formative experience of beauty, discipline, community, and prayer. For the parish, it was a powerful witness to our deep commitment to liturgical excellence, the fullness of Catholic tradition, and love of our faith.





MEET A PARISHIONER: THE RIEGER FAMILY

This is the fifth installment of our bulletin feature, Meet a Parishioner! Each month, we will spotlight a parishioner or family to help you get to know your fellow parishioners, build a

sense of community, and stay connected in Christ. This month, meet Paul, Therese, Michael, James, and Matthew Rieger!

St. Gertrude Parish: Would you please tell us a little bit about yourselves and how you first found St. Gertrude Parish?

Paul Rieger: In 1999, work at P&G brought us to Cincinnati for a second time. We had moved seven times in 14 years and lived in the Anderson area for two years during one of those moves. It was now time to settle in a community and create a home for our family, and Therese really wanted to live in Montgomery. At the time, our sons Michael and Jamie were five and three, and Therese was pregnant with our youngest son, Matthew. We rented at Indian Creek Apartments until Matthew was born and then moved to a house a short walk to St. Gertrude Parish. After visiting several parishes in the area, we knew St. Gertrude was home. We've been parishioners for 27 years.

SGP: What do you love about St. Gertrude Parish?

Paul: We love the Dominicans and their charism. When we first arrived, the priory was filled with so many good and faithful priests who were dynamic homilists and brought the message of the Gospels to life for us. We love seeing the young men who arrive as novices and often return years later in various assignments. We know when one great Dominican priest leaves, another arrives. It's a cycle we have greatly enjoyed over the years. We also love how vibrant the campus is with the school, the many lay-led ministries, and parishioners who are on fire with the Gospel and striving to deepen their faith.

SGP: In what ways are you involved at St. Gertrude Parish?

Paul: In the early days, Therese was very involved with the school, helping in the classroom and the cafeteria. She was also very involved in the Twinning committee that worked to support our Dominican sister parish in Kenya and then the local St. Leo the Great Parish in North Fairmont. Our boys worked at St. Leo's Food Pantry, and we continue to support their great work of welcoming into our archdiocese refugees from Burundi, Africa, and Guatemala. I have been involved with our Catholic Men's Fellowship since 1999 when Kevin Lynch invited all men to "answer the call" and come to the Catholic Men's Conference and our group here at the parish. I remember sitting at Mass listening to Kevin's invitation thinking, *I don't want to answer the call.* As soon as I had that thought, I knew I was going to accept Kevin's invitation, and I have never looked back. That "yes" led

me to say "yes" to many invitations to serve, including on the parish's Evangelization and Alpha teams, and as a mentor and sponsor for Becoming Catholic.

SGP: How has the parish helped you grow as disciples?

Paul: During a time we needed it most, the parish community showed us, by their witness, how to grow as disciples. Therese is in her tenth year of recovery from a massive stroke due to a brain aneurysm rupture that left her paralyzed on her right side. She spent three-and-a-half months in the Neuro ICU and rehab hospitals before coming home and enduring intensive therapy and numerous medical procedures—all with a smile. Our friends at St. Gertrude prayed for us, fed us, visited us, and helped us in ways they will never know. There are so many good and faithful husbands and wives at our parish who are our role models.

SGP: How has St. Gertrude School impacted your family?

Paul: St. Gertrude School was a great experience for us and our sons. It reminded us of our childhood, where the Catholic school and parish we attended was the center of our family life. At SGS, our friends were fellow parents, and our sons went to school, played sports, and enjoyed scouts and other activities with their classmates. Most of all, we knew their education was grounded in the Truths of our Catholic faith and put God, our Creator, at the center. It academically and spiritually prepared them for high school at Moeller and their universities and studies. SGS grounded our sons in the Truth and equipped them with the graces of the sacraments to call on and help them with any challenges they face in life.

SGP: What is a fun or unique fact about your family?

Paul: Four of us have proudly matriculated from the University of Michigan. Jamie is the black sheep of the family since he went to the University of Chicago to study and play football. He did, however, proudly wear the "M" at Moeller.

SGP: Do you or your family have a patron/favorite saint?

Paul: St. Therese the Little Flower remains Therese's patron saint. I developed a devotion to the Blessed Mother, whom I always turn to for intercession; I entrust my sons, wife, and marriage to her in my morning prayers.

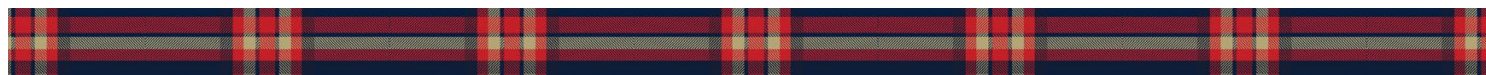

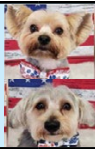


